

Race Chair Report for August 2020

The second race of the Long Beach Harbor High Point series was conducted on August 22. The Harbor Pursuit Race had 24 boats entered. Best finish from NYCLB was Ben Smith's Renegade in ninth place. The next race in this High Points Series will be the NYCLB "All Hands Race" on 12 September. The final race in this series will be LSFYC "Beat the Heat Race" on September 26.

The second SIBYC Thursday evening Pop Tops series of 4 races completed on August 13. NYCLB boats were first in two of the fleets. Raptor won PHRF "A" and Renegade was first in PHRF "B" fleet. NYCLB boat also competing were Windfall (7th PHRF "B") and Dawn Patrol (3rd PHRF "D")

Tuesday Senior Salty Sailor series continues. We still are not having meetings before or after our races. But we have been getting more of the non-boat owners hooked up with boats by phone and getting more people out sailing.

Here are the recent results:

Tuesday 28 July: There were 8 boats participating. The course was #11. That is a 6.6 mile course from Mark 38 to Mark 30 on the outer break wall, then to Mark 39 near Shoreline, followed by a return to Mark 38 and finally a finish at the "A" buoy in the Alamitos Bay entrance. Winds ranged for 8-15 knots and 195-225 degrees M. A couple of boats with minimum crews elected to sail with jib only that made setting the start time a bit tricky. It worked OK for one but put the other far in back of the fleet. Macs made up time and caught everyone in the fleet for another first. Windhaven, Swell Lover, and Fiat Lux were all close to Macs at the finish, while Dos Amigos was not able to close the distance on the group. By the time Raptor's start time came, the whole fleet looked like Sabots on the horizon. The fleet just had too much time and too much wind for the late starting boats to catch them. Finish order was: Macs, Swell Lover, Windhaven, Fiat Lux. Dos Amigos, Raptor, Lucky boy, Shadowfax. Every boat had a great race again!

Tuesday 4 August: Started with 5 boats. After sailing for an hour with no boats near the first mark the VHF radio started to chatter. Windhaven and Swell Lover dropped out and headed home. Dos Amigos was seen with sails up going at least 6 knots (in a 2-knot breeze) but heading towards the harbor. Shadowfax and Raptor agreed to a shortened course to the first mark. Shadowfax got to Mark 37 a minute before Raptor. Shadowfax declared the winner.

Tuesday 11 August: We had 5 Boats. The course was #20. That is a 7.8-mile course. The first leg was a beat to a Starboard rounding of Mark 36, then a fast reach to a Starboard rounding of Mark 27. That was followed by a dead downwind run to Mark 34 by the Belmont pier followed by another fast reach to Mark 32. The final legs were a beat back to Mark 38 and a final run to the finish at the Alamitos Bay entrance. The wind was definitely up so a couple of boats again chose to sail with just jibs. The "race committee" hasn't yet found a good "no main sail "offset number so the jib only boats are not able to hold off the boats with main and jib. Fiat Lux got to the lead and was holding off Raptor until they both got to Mark 32. But, on the upwind leg back to Mark 38 Raptor was pointing high - going fast and pulled away. Finish Order: Raptor, Fiat Lux, Windhaven, Dos Amigos, Lucky Boy.

Tuesday 18 August: Six boats racing. The course was #19. That is a 6.9 mile course. The winds were light and got lighter during the race. The first leg was a beat to Mark 36 on the outer wall, then a long down wind to Mark 32. That was followed a reach to Mark 34 by the Belmont pier. The final leg was a beat back to Mark 38. The "race committee" gave Raptor and extra 2 minute penalty to try and even the fleet finishes. By the time Raptor got to the first weather mark in a lightening breeze it was becoming clear that the fleet wasn't going to need the help. While Fiat Lux and Swell Lover fought for the win, Raptor rounded Mark 34 with only Macs close enough to maybe catch before the end. Swell lover won by seconds over Fiat Lux. Raptor didn't catch Macs and just missed the 3 PM time limit cut off. Everyone had another great day on the water! Order of finish was Swell Lover, Fiat Lux, Windhaven, Lucky boy, Max and Raptor.


Hello Navy Yacht Club Family!!

Member's Corner

Jeffrey Petersen, son of NYCLB members Forrest and Denise Petersen, started his plebe (Freshman) year at the United States Naval Academy on 30 June 2020. All 1150 in his class reported to the Academy in Annapolis, Maryland over a period of four days in late June.

A typical I-Day (Induction Day) is held on one day for all incoming midshipmen, but due to the Covid-19 pandemic, they were spread out over 4 days to allow for Covid testing protocols and proper social distancing. Upon arrival, all midshipmen candidates were tested for Covid and assigned a roommate for a 14- day, in-room quarantine. Anyone who exhibits symptoms or tests positive are immediately isolated (roommate too) and treated, as necessary by USNA medical staff until they test negative. After the mandatory quarantine period and once they are confirmed to test negative for the virus, they rejoin their fellow plebes in the traditional summer training.

Normally training lasts 6 weeks, but due to the need for quarantine, the training was compressed and some of the lessons were delivered online during quarantine. August 7-9 was to be the traditional Plebe Parents' Weekend, a joyous reunion of family members at the Academy in Annapolis to celebrate the end of the summer training, but was cancelled in order to protect the "bubble" that now exists among the midshipmen and training staff at USNA. Communication is allowed through the US Mail and occasional video conference calls are allowed to maintain morale. It now appears that the Petersens will have to wait until Christmas break to see their son Jeffrey in person, but they are so proud of their boy.



IMPORTANT NOTICE!!!!

Notice to all members of Navy Yacht Club Long Beach:

After months of being without the use of our beloved yacht club facility and numerous attempts to reach out to communicate with the City of Long Beach and it's various departments we are now able to gather together under very strict conditions. These conditions are cast in concrete and must not be violated.

- 1. An absolute limit of 10 persons on the facility at any time. At no time is there to be more than 10 people on the club property.
- 2. Everyone must wear a facial mask.
- 3. Everyone must wear their name badge.
- 4. Everyone must have their temperature taken and recorded before entry is permitted,
- 5. Everyone must sign in on the attendance register. Log must be maintained and kept to record name, time in and out, temperature of each person entering the gates.
- 6. Everyone must wash/sanitize their hands every 30 minutes.
- 7. Everyone must maintain a social distance of 6 feet. People residing in the same house are exempt.
- 8. You must not shake hands, hi-fives, fist bump, elbow tap or any other physical exchange.
- 9. There is no potluck. Everyone brings their own food and will not share with anyone.
- 10. **The bar is closed. No honor bar.** You may bring your own beverage. Beer and wine only. **No hard liquor.**
- 11. The clubhouse building is closed. No entry permitted. Will be open ONLY when a board member or an appointed officer or Dorothy Owens for ships store sales items. Maximum number of persons is 2 inside the clubhouse.

The State of California, and in particular Los Angeles County has experienced an increase in the number of people contracting the Covid-19. The latest restriction laid down by the State of California is to close all indoor operations. As long as we stay outside the building and follow the above conditions, we are not in violation of the Health Department restrictions.

Because of the occupancy limit, please limit the time you spend on site to accommodate our fellow members (I think one hour is a reasonable amount of time). Also refrain from bringing <u>non-member</u> <u>guests</u>, except for those that need assistance for care. There will be time in the future when this pandemic has passed to bring friends to the club.

We have been given a small gift. Please share that gift with your fellow members and follow the above conditions so we all may enjoy the fun and friendship of our club.

Covid-19 is real and thousands of people all over our beautiful country have died from it. I hope you will exercise common sense and seriously consider is your health (life) or the health (life) of your loved one (s) worth the risk you place yourself in when you join gatherings with other people. Please exercise "Stay safer".


