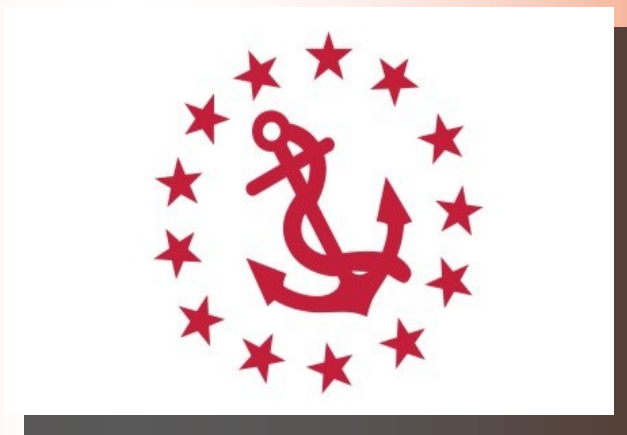

Safety & Seamanship – Nautical Flag Display

Flags are an important part of both military and nautical tradition and a key component of keeping your yacht “Bristol fashion.” This month we’ll discuss two of the most important flags in our flag locker, the national ensign and the club burgee.



American recreational yachts have a choice of what to fly as a national ensign. You may fly the civil ensign (“stars & stripes”) or you may choose to fly the yacht ensign. The yacht ensign has 13 stripes but in the canton instead of 50 stars there is a circle of thirteen stars around a white fouled anchor.

Traditionally the yacht ensign was flown by documented vessels (registered with the Coast Guard rather than state registration) but current fashion allows the yacht ensign to be flown by any recreational vessel. The yacht ensign should not be used in international or foreign waters. The ensign may be displayed whenever the boat is underway, and from 0800 to sunset when the boat is occupied in port or at anchor.

The guidance for the correct size is approximately one inch on the “fly” (horizontal) for every foot of boat length. Since flags are sold in standard sizes a 30 foot boat, for example, might choose either a 16x24 or a 24x36 inch ensign. Sailboats tend to go toward the larger end, powerboats toward smaller ensigns.

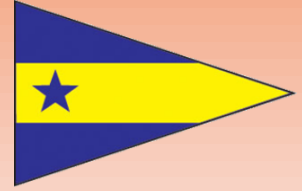
There are several locations for display of the national ensign depending on the configuration of your boat:

For sailboats or powerboats rigged with a gaff, the gaff is the place of highest honor so this is where the national ensign is displayed (see our club flagpole for an example) From a flagstaff mounted at the transom, preferably either on centerline or to the starboard side

The one location where the national ensign should **not** be flown is from a yardarm or spreader. Although too commonly seen around the marina, **this is incorrect**.

Also incorrect is display of a worn, dirty or tattered national ensign. Although you may feel it makes the boat look “salty” it is in fact a sign of disrespect. Dirty flags can be washed and minor tears can be repaired. Flags that are faded, worn or tattered beyond repair can be turned over to your local Scout troop or American Legion post for proper, respectful retirement.

A burgee is a small flag denoting membership in a yacht club or boating organization. The Navy Yacht Club burgee is described in Article XIII of the club by laws. Any member of the club in good standing is entitled to fly the NYCLB burgee.



Traditionally the burgee was flown from the masthead (again, see our Navy Yacht Club flagpole). Frequently a “pig stick” was used to extend the burgee above the masthead. However, most sailboats now fly the burgee from the starboard spreader. Powerboats and sailboats may also fly the burgee from a small staff on the bow.

If you’re a member of more than one club or association, only one burgee should be flown on your boat at any given time. This may be the club where the boat is based or the club in whose home waters the boat is currently located. And of course if you’re participating in a club-sponsored event you should fly that club’s burgee (if you’re a member).

Sunday Funday Three Hour Cruise

We had a very successful inaugural event on September 25. X-Sail (Tony & Becky Rietdyk), Ruby (Laura Farmer) and Matthew 4:19 (Bryan and Casey Barras) hosted several members and friends. The boats picked up their crews at the dock at Navy and enjoyed a brief cruise around the harbor, followed by happy hour at the club.

We have another event scheduled for Sunday, October 30. Although for the first event all boats met at the club this is not mandatory. The meeting location, schedule and itinerary are completely up to each participating skipper. The way this works is:

Skippers sign up their boats and indicate how many crew you can take. Sign up list is posted in the club galley or contact Fleet Captain and let me know

Crew sign up – also a sign up list in the galley or email Fleet Captain. Let me know how many in your party and if you have a preference for a particular boat or marina

About a week before the event I’ll pair crew up with boats and send to everyone who signed up

Skippers reach out to assigned crew to arrange meeting location, time and any other necessary details

Go out and have fun!

Ahoy All Members!

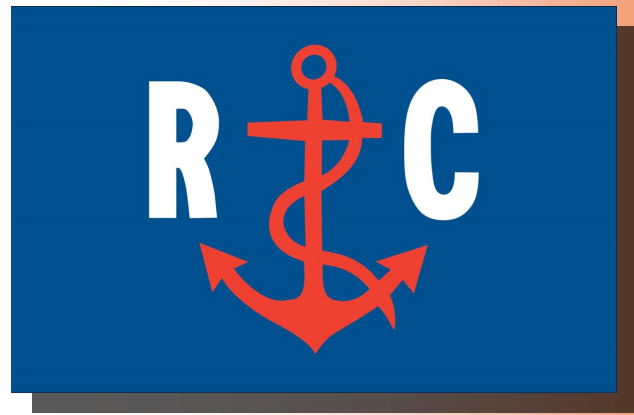

Notice of Race

- Rules:** This event is governed by the rules defined in the current edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- Sailing Instructions & Course:** NYCLB **Course Chart RC 2021-S** and NYCLB **Course Chart IF 2021**, and associated Sailing Instructions will be used. These are available on the NYCLB website (nyclb.org). Amendments will be posted to the Official Notice Board and NYCLB website not later than 1800 of the day before the race.
- Eligibility and Entry:**
 - This event is open to members of all SCYA Yacht Clubs with a valid PHRF certificate. The following classes are invited to participate: Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker and any One-Design Class of 3 or more boats. All boats shall use their Area C Buoy handicaps. A boat wishing to race Non-Spinnaker shall use the non-spinnaker offset rating printed on her PHRF certificate.
 - Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form or entering online on the NYCLB website and submitting the required fee of \$15 (**\$20 if entering after October 10**) to one of the addresses below not later than October 12, 2022.
- Schedule:** Two races are scheduled to be sailed on October 15, 2022. The scheduled time of the first warning signal is 1155.
- Penalty System:**
 - RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty
 - A boat may take a post-race penalty as described in U.S. Sailing Prescription Appendix V2
- Risk Statement & Waiver of Liability:**
 - RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
 - The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- Prizes & Social:** Trophies for this race and the Long Beach Harbor High Points Series will be presented at NYCLB following the race. There also will be daily first trophies for each race. . There will be a no-host bar and refreshments.
