The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they are found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

Race Committee Chair







The 2019 racing year is over. First racing series of 2020 starts on 4 January. Results are in for the last series of 2019, the Sunday Sailors Series. In PHRF A, Raptor was first and Shadowfax finished in third. In PHRF C Dawn Patrol was 4th and Renegade finished in 6th.

Tuesday's Salty Sailors sailing continues - we will sail year-round. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself, bring you friends and family – there is always a skipper in need of crew. We meet at the the club any Tuesday at 11:30. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart. The current chart dated 12 Nov 2019 changes the rating of the J109s from 96 to 72. This attempt to "level the playing field" has been a partial success - at least on reaching courses.

The Tuesday SS results follow:

Tuesday 26 November: On this Tuesday we had six boats on course # 37, a 6.1 mile cruise of Long Beach harbor. The wind ranged from 5.5 to 10.0 knots.

Our first leg was a beat out to the East end of the breakwater rounding Mark 31 to starboard, from there we headed on an enjoyable reach splitting two anchored freighters on our way to the Long Beach Center Channel R "2" buoy - Mark 27 rounding it to starboard. As we headed off towards Island Grissom on a wing-on-wing run, the wind decrease and a work barge decided to cut through the fleet on our approach to Mark 39. The last leg to the finish was a 2.5 mile tight reach to Mark 38.

In first place, by miles, Macs followed by Shadowfax, Callisto II, SLainte, Luck Boy and Raptor- DNF

Tuesday 3 December: We had 4 boats ready and eager to start a race - just needed some wind. After choosing a shortened Course # 24 we set out in 3 knots towards Mark 27 with the intension of sailing back to Mark 38 and finishing at the Alamitos entrance "A" buoy. Half way to Mark 27, just when Raptor caught Macs and Windhaven - the wind died. Macs and Lucky Boy promptly turned and under power returned to port. Windhaven and Raptor negotiated another "shortened course" and sailed back to the Alamitos entrance buoy in 0.2 to 2 knots.

In first place, Raptor. Windhaven was in second. Macs and Lucky Boy DNF.

Tuesday 10 December: We had four boats on course # 1, a 3.1 mile condensed cruise of the harbor. The wind ranged from 3.3 to 7.0 knots.

Our first leg was a beat out to the east end of the breakwater rounding Mark 31 to starboard, from there we headed off on a reach towards the Belmont Pier rounding Mark 34 to starboard. The next leg to Mark 38 was a beat, half of the fleet chose to go above Island Chaffee and half chose to go below Chaffee, our final leg was a reach to the finish at the Alamitos Bay A-Buoy.

In first place, Shadowfax followed very closely by Macs, Callisto and Raptor.

Tuesday 17 December: On this Tuesday we had four boats on course # 24, a 5.1 mile west to east cruise of the harbor. The wind ranged from 1.8 to 7.0 knots.

Our first leg was a 2.5 mile tight reach to the Long Beach Center Chanel Buoy R"2" from there we headed east on a 2.8 mile reach to the A-Buoy at the entrance to Alamitos Bay. Lots of dolphin and seals along the way.

In first place, Shadowfax followed Callisto, Windhaven and Lucky Boy.

Tuesday 24 December: No race on Christmas Eve.
