

Navy YC Long Beach racing is over for the 2019 calendar year. Our race, the Navy Day Regatta was conducted this past Saturday, 19 October. We had a good turnout for this two-race day. Thirteen boats were entered in three classes. The first race was a short windward / leeward race with a downwind finish. The second race was a 8.7 K mile race with an inside finish at the club.

In the PHRF "A" fleet we had five boats. Flaquita finished first in both races, second in both races was the NYCLB's Raptor, third (again in both races) was the Shock 35, Whiplash, fourth was Dos Amigos (both races) and in fifth was Gator sailing with all their friends and family in memory of Gator's long time skipper Todd Wheatley. Todd passed the Monday prior to this race.

In the PHRF "B" fleet it was Syndicate in first with a (1,1), NYCLB's Renegade was second with a (2,2), followed by Love & War (3,4) and Bilbo Baggins (3,4).

In the "C" fleet; in first was One More Time wining both races. Swell Lover was in second with seconds in both races. Fiat Lux and Bellissima were third and fourth.

The turnout for the after-race Tacos by Becky was excellent. Trophies from our race sponsors Bahia Marine and Spice Girls were presented after a moment of silence to honor Todd Wheatley. The great crowd enjoyed the light wind sea stories, the tacos, and some adult beverages. The club made a nice profit too!

Our PRO, Tony also presented the trophies from the Long Beach Harbor High Point Series. First place was Syndicate, followed by Fiat Lux and Dos Amigos.

Tuesday's Salty Sailors sailing continues - we will sail year-round. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself, bring you friends and family — there is always a skipper in need of crew. We meet at the club any Tuesday at 11:30. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart. Gather up your friends and family and join us.

The Tuesday SS results follow:

Tuesday 1 October: On this Salty Sailor's race we had five boats on course # 56. a 6.3-mile cruise. The wind ranged from 6.5 to 11.0 knots.

Our first leg was a tight reach to the Anaheim Bay Channel Buoy "2" for a look at the lobster pots and kelp surrounding the oil platform Esther. From there we head off on a reach across the bay to Mark 34 for a look at the Belmont Pier. Our next leg was a beat back to Mark 38 on the southeast side of Island Chaffee and then off to the finish at the Alamitos Bay A Buoy.

In first place, Shadowfax followed by Green Dragon, Raptor, Macs and Lucky Boy.

Tuesday 8 October: On this Tuesday we had five boats on course # 52, a 6.5-mile cruise. The wind was in a range from 5.0 to 10.0 knots.

Our first leg was a beat out to the east end of the wall taking Mark 31 to starboard, and dodging kelp in the process, from there we head off on a reach across the bay to the Belmont Pool at Mark 39, again to starboard. The next leg found us paralleling the beach on a broad reach as we head to Mark 32, again rounding to starboard, then we headed off on a beat to the finish at Mark 38. All-in-all a fun afternoon sail.

In first place, Raptor followed by Shadowfax, Swell Lover, Macs and Lucky Boy.

Tuesday 15 October: This Tuesday we had six boats on course # 7, a 7.2-mile cruise of the harbor. The wind ranged from 5.0 to 13.5 knots.

The first leg was a beat out to the east end of the breakwater taking Mark 31 to starboard, the beat continued as we headed west along the wall towards Queens Gate taking Mark 36 to starboard (see how this is setting up). The next leg found us on a reach towards Island Grissom, taking Mark 39 to starboard and then running the beach on a tight reach to Mark 32 again to starboard and the finish at the virtual A Buoy. Just a delightful afternoon sail with our sailing friends. Oh, and John Setchell, on Windfall, was able to join us after a year hiatus.

In first place Raptor followed by Windfall, Shadowfax, Windhaven, Swell Lover, and Lucky Boy.

Tuesday 22 October: On this Tuesday we had seven boats on course # 20, a 7.8-mile cruise of the harbor. The wind ranged from 5.0 to 16.5 knots.

Our first leg was a beat out to the west end of the breakwater taking Mark 36 to starboard, the next leg was a run to Mark 27, the Long Beach center channel R2 Buoy, from there we head off on a downwind run towards the Belmont Pier, rounding Mark 34, to starboard. Our next leg paralleled the beach on our way to Mark 32, from there we headed out on a beat to the east side of Island Chaffee rounding Mark 38 to port and off on reach to the finish at the Alamitos Bay A Buoy.

In first place Lucky Boy, followed closely by Shadowfax, Swell Lover, Windhaven, Love and War, Macs and new to the fleet SLainte.
