Race Committee Chair







NYCLB held its last formal race of the year, the "Navy Day Regatta". in October. The last series of the year out of Alamitos Bay, the Sunday Sailors Series (SIBYC), is waiting to get started at the end of November after the first race in the series was canceled. The SIBYC race committee canceled the 8 November race due to winds predicted to be 30-35 Knots.

NYCLB continues with our informal racing with the Tuesday Salty Sailors throughout the year. We still are not having meetings before our races. But we have been getting more of the non-boatowners hooked up with boats by phone and getting more people out sailing. If you would like to join us as crew or boat owner send a note to the race chair "HeinzLB@icloud.com", we will include you on the race notice/results email.

Recent results:

Tuesday October 27: We had 7 boats racing. The wind at the start was in the range of 7-8 knots coming from 240 degrees. The courses # 37. Course length was 6.1 NM. We tried to pick a course with at least one beat, but it turned out the first leg to Mark 31 on the outer break was was more of a one tack beat. The course then went to Mark 27 near the cruise terminal, followed by a trip to Mark 39 near Shoreline and finally back to Mark 38. Raptor didn't catch any boats by the time they got to Mark 39. By that time California Star was far ahead of the fleet, well on the way to a "horizon job" on the fleet. The middle of the fleet came to gather on the reach between Mark 39 and Mark 38. In a contest to see could finish second to California Star, boats got passed to windward and to leeward. Many greetings were shared between boats as they came closer together and then farther apart. Results: California Stars, Raptor, Lulu, Swell Lover, Windhaven, Macs, and Lucky Boy.

Tuesday November 3: We had 8 boats racing. The wind at the start was in the range of 7-8 knots coming from 225 degrees. The courses # 42. Course length was 6.3 NM. We again tried to pick a reaching course. First leg from the Start at Mark 38 to Mark 35 near the Seal Beach pier was a nice deep reach. Back the other way to Mark 27 was almost a beat - most boats were able to make it on one tack. Final leg back to Mark 38 was also a nice each reach. California Star was way out front again, Dos Amigos closed to within a minute of them, and Macs just nosed out Raptor for third place. Results: California Stars, Dos Amigos, Macs, Raptor, Lulu, Windhaven, Hokulani and Lucky Boy.

Tuesday November 10: On this Tuesday we had 8 boats racing. The wind at the start was in the range of 8 knots coming from 235 degrees. The courses was # 54 with a course length of 7.4 NM. We again picked a reaching course. First leg from the Start at Mark 38 to Mark 39 near the Shoreline Marina was a very tight reach. The next leg was a one tack beat to Mark 36 on the outer break wall. Final leg back to Mark 38 was dead down wind. Windhaven passed the one boat that started in front of her and never let anyone catch her. Most of the rest of the fleet finished in the order they started. Raptor started last and finished last. But, everyone was close together at the "A" buoy finish mark. Results: Windhaven, Swell Lover, California Stars, Macs, Lulu, Hokulani, Lucky Boy and Raptor.

Tuesday November 17: We had 9 boats racing. The course was # 12 with a course length of 5.7 NM. The wind at the start was in the range of 8 knots coming from 220 degrees. The wind varied quite a bit, from 3 -8 knots and from 190 to 220 degrees, on the way to the first mark. The bigger challenge was visibility - very thick fog right on the surface. Finding the marks required good GPS coordinates. Figuring out which moored tankers would be in the way was also helpful in picking the right line from Mark 37 to Mark 27. The leg from Mark 27 to Mark 34 (near the Belmont pier) was a deep run - the wind was too light for all the boats to run with the jib wing-on-wing. With the visibility so low it was hard to know where one was in the race. We tried to keep track of which boats we passed in the fog. We passed Lucky Boy twice and never saw Syndicate after the start. Some boats finally had enough of feeling their way around the course and headed directly home. We figured out where Syndicate was when the radioed their finish time as we approached Mark 32. They warned the fleet that you can't see the Alamitos entrance break-wall from Mark 32 - tricky to make sure you sail high enough to miss it! Results: Syndicate, Raptor, Fiat Lux, Lulu, California Stars. Boats DNF or no time reported: Lucky Boy, Windhaven, Hokulani, and Macs.


