On a positive note, we have received a new lease with the City of Long Beach which covers fifteen years total. A five year period to start with and two five year options thereafter. After a thorough review by the Lease Committee, we are going back to the city with some minor clarifications and do not anticipate a problem with having them accepted.

Since last month, we have also received parking permits for our members that do not have a slip in Shoreline or Alamitos Bay Marinas. Those permits will be issued individually to members and will have to be signed for each year. The Marine department has assured us that Shoreline permits will be honored in Alamitos Bay and the Alamitos Bay permits will be honored in Shoreline except on Holidays or special events. We are required to provide the Marine department a list of those permit holders monthly, so the permits are numbered and assigned to each member, they are not car specific. The marine department and the City of Long Beach have agreed to our use of the long dock adjacent to the club for events we have outlined to the Marine department at least through May. We are hoping that they will extend that in increments through the balance of this year and in years to come.

Hello All,

As most of you are aware, I've been providing you updates on a number of issues I worked on as your Commodore and continue to do so, as these issues now approach completion. They are: NYCLB's new Lease development with the City, the dock access fee waiver with the Marina, and parking passes for members without boats.

I am very pleased to announce that on February 5th, Long Beach City Council approved the new lease with NYCLB that includes all that I have previously informed you about: rent at \$900.00 per month, up to 15 years with two five-year renewals and Capital Improvements provided by the club over the term of the lease. This new lease is under review by the current Board of Directors and is awaiting signature once approved by our Board.

City Council also approved our request for a fee waiver for dock access during NYCLB events until June. Next month I will provide you with an update on our request for a fee waiver beyond June, and I will also give you any details you may need to utilize this privilege.

In addition, all of you should have received the Parking Pass distribution notice I sent out to all on February 20. You may pick up your parking pass during potluck any Friday until March 22. You will need to sign for receipt of the pass and agree to follow the club's guidelines and Marina rules. It is important that all pass-holders comply with the guidelines and the Marina's rules for this privilege to continue.

Don't forget April 6 is Opening Day with registration starting at 1:00 pm and ceremony at 2:00. Please RSVP on our website: <u>www.NYCLB.ORG</u>. This year's Opening Day luncheon will be catered by The Abbey. NYCLB members and dignitaries from invited yacht clubs will receive a complementary luncheon. There will, however, be a \$15 charge for members' guests.

Last Saturday four Navy YC boats sailed in the Seal Beach YC Saturday Sailors Series; Dawn Patrol (Paul Turang), Renegade (Ben Smith), Shadowfax (Chris Mewes) and Raptor (Heinz Butner). There were two races this day to make up for the race canceled two weeks ago due to high winds associated with a storm front. With four races of the five race series (one through-out) competed, in the PHRF B fleet, Raptor is in first place with Shadowfax close behind in third. In the PHRF C fleet Dawn Patrol is currently in fourth place.

Tuesday's Salty Sailors sailing continues. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself, bring you friends and family – there is always a skipper in need of crew. We meet at the the club any Tuesday at 11:30. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart: dated **2 November 2018**.

We have recently had to leave boats at the dock because we didn't have enough crew to adequately crew all the boats available. So gather up your friends and family and join us. The weather is getting back to California standards.

The Tuesday SS results follow:

Tuesday 29 Jan: On this Tuesday we had four boats on course 55, a 5.4 mile race, starting with a fun reach to Mark 27, followed by a tight reach to mark 37 on the wall and a downwind run to mark 38 taking it to starboard, finishing the course on a tight reach at the harbor entrance buoy. The wind ranged between 4.0 and maxed at 10.0 knots. It was a fun afternoon sail with Swell Lover in first place followed by Green Dragon, Raptor and Shadowfax bring up the rear with a tactical error. Even when another boat (like Raptor) is obviously going the wrong way - cover the boat behind!

Tuesday 5 Feb: Second time this year we were rained out!

Tuesday 12 Feb: We had four boats on course 56. The distance was 6.3 miles. The wind ranged from 3.5 to 7.5 knots, mostly in 4.0 range. The harbor tour started with a tight reach out to the Anaheim Bay Channel Buoy, so we could talk to the seals sunning on the buoy. The second leg was a long reach back to the Belmont Pier with lots of Dolphin sightings. On the third leg we beat back to Mark 38 with the finish at the harbor entrance A buoy. In first place with his big new head sail was Raptor, followed 4 minutes later by Shadowfax, Swell Lover and Windhaven.



Tuesday 19 Feb: Last Tuesday we had four boats on course 54 the distance was 7.1 miles. The wind ranged from 5.5 to 10.5 knots, mostly in 8.0 range. The harbor race started with a reach to the east side of Island Grissom (Mark 39), then we headed up on a beat to Mark 36, followed with a run to the Alamitos Bay entrance A Buoy. In first place, again, with his big new 155 sail was Raptor, followed by Shadowfax (with his Heinz made me do it 155), then Windhaven and Swell Lover.

Hello all,

This is Staff Commodore Victor Padilla; I thought I'd write an article for the Scuttlebutt Members Corner.

As some of you know, Pam and I have left California to the beautiful state of Wyoming. How did that happen? Well I'm going to try and tell you.

I grew up in California and went into the Air Force after high school. Spent 20 plus years and some of that with the Air Force Reserves. I was a Land Surveyor with a private company in Santa Ana for over 33 years. I have always thought of myself as a person that would stay in Southern California. Pam and I even had a 27- foot sail boat for about 30 years.

I had even traveled with my ex-in-laws on their 43-foot sailboat to Mexico & Annapolis, MD, and thought that this is what I want to do when I retire. That is what I thought we would do, as Pam grew up sailing and we could do this. The weather in So. Cal. was the best for all of this. We love our dear friends at Navy Yacht Club Long Beach, for which I was a Commodore in 1999 and 2014. I wouldn't give up those memories for anything.



Pam grew up mostly in California and NYCLB where her father was Commodore in 1979. She worked for the same bank for 33 years and retired after a bad robbery. She then went to work for Southern California Yachting Association where she worked for an additional 3 years until she retired.

So here comes the TWIST.

We visit my best friend's family in Wyoming about 7 years ago. We went to a small town called Star Valley Ranch, which is on the west side of Wyoming and about 50 miles south of the town of Jackson. We fell in love with the town and the people. That first visit, when we went and just looked at properties, it was in the month of June and people were out in their front yards getting ready for the summer and they just waved at us as we drove by. To this day I will never forget that and later in this story I'll explain. After that day I had wanted to sell our house in Huntington Beach and move. I knew I could get work as a Land Surveyor. Our friend told both of us not to do that as work here is hard to find and if you do find work it will be around minimum wage. I did a little research and most of the surveying jobs were on the east side of the state, and didn't want to go there. She just told us to wait till you are both retired.

So advance 7 years and I am retired and I told Pam she could retire also. We put our house up for sale. We found a realtor from a good neighbor of ours and with the market on the up side we felt good. Our realtor had a price in mind and Pam says it's too low. We eventually shoot for the moon. Long story short, we have a bidding war for our house in Huntington Beach and with that, I call our realtor in Wyoming and say we are now upping our price for our new home.

They say when you retire you should down size which we ignored and we fell in love with a 6 bedroom, 4-bath house on 1.5 acres. Pam and I always wanted a big home to host family and friends. I have a 2 car/shop adjacent to the home with a 2-car garage attached to the house. The house came with a riding mower and snow blower attachment, which I have been using with all this snow that we have been getting.

We are enjoying the SMALL TOWN life-style. When we first got here on a Sunday, we thought we'd go into town and get something we were missing for dinner. We get into the town of Thayne, which is only 6 miles away, and the market is closed and next to it, the hardware store is closed, too. They are all closed on Sundays.



Now for the small-life style. We had someone come and look at our forced air heating. I'm in town and hear my name being called out. I look across the street; it's Zack, our heating guy in his truck saying to me that he'll be up at the house in an hour. Another thing is that now that it's cold, people leave their vehicles running when going into the post office, hardware store and even the market. It took me about 2 months before I did the same. I even leave my IPhone on the dash and don't think anything of it when at the Post Office, bank, or hardware store.

A friend here also told me of a Veterans Breakfast on the third Saturday of the month. I've gone three times now and enjoy the camaraderie among us. I think the most talked about item is GUNS. Wyoming is a very pro-gun state. Pam and I just took a 4 hour gun safety class sponsored by the city and received a certificate. We eventually want to get our concealed carry permit. Here in Wyoming, you don't need a permit to carry but if you go to other states, that's where you need the permit from the State of Wyoming.

I had mentioned earlier about the small town life-style and here's some information. As you come down the mountain into the Star Valley, there are about 7 towns. First town has a population of 195, and then the next has 2002, then 147, then 382, then 164, then 866. Where we live in Star Valley Ranch we have 1581 and, I'm guessing, only 1000 in the winter because of the snowbirds that leave in the winter. Now for an eye opener, the State of Wyoming has a population of 579,315 (2017) and just the county of L.A. has 10.16 Million (2017).

We love our area of Wyoming. Great neighbors and like I said earlier, you always wave to persons passing you by in their vehicles or out in their yards.

We have been keeping busy around the house and with our photography. We went and took photos of a start of a dog sled race. Pam even babysits once a week and taking on more babysitting jobs for extra cash for her self. We are looking forward to the rest of this winter and into springtime. The one thing that we are both looking forward to is fly-fishing on the rivers and streams when the weather gets warmer.
