Hello Navy Yacht Club Family!!



The Saturday Sailors Series Races 1 and 2 were held February 6. This is the first race of the first series for 2021. Finally, sail racing is underway in southern California. After two races NYCLB racers are in the hunt: In the double handed class Shadowfax in in 2nd, in PHRF A Raptor is in 3rd, Renegade racing for LSFYC is in 3rd in PHRF C, in the PHRF D Fleet Dawn Patrol is in 2nd and new member Dennis Tran racing Pacific Wolf is in 3rd. Good luck to all the Navy Yacht Club members in this five race series!

Race Committee: Navy Yacht Club Long Beach traditionally runs three regattas each year, the Armed Forces Day race in May, the All Hands race in September and the Navy Day regatta in October. Race Committee volunteers in on-the-water and shoreside roles are critical in putting on an efficient, well-run race and a pleasant event for participants at the club afterwards (COVID permitting of course).

On-the-water roles include timing, signaling, setting marks, communicating and sighting the start line. We'll provide training prior to your first race to make sure you know how to do your job, how you fit into the team and what to expect on race day. Shoreside roles include setting up and taking down tables & chairs as well as helping with the bar and refreshments.

Tuesday Salty Sailors: NYCLB continues with our informal racing with the Tuesday Salty Sailors throughout the year. We still are not able to have meetings before our races. But, we have been getting more of the non-boatowners hooked up with boats by phone and getting more people out sailing. If you would like to join us as crew or boat owner send a note to the race chair "HeinzLB@icloud.com", we will included you on the race notice/results email. Gary Green just notified us he will be sailing his (new to him) C&C 121 in the upcoming Tuesday SS races.

Tuesday 19 January: We intended to race. Had the jib on the furler all ready to leave the dock. Up to then the wind was in the 4-7 knot range. The wind suddenly went to the 20 knot range. Checked the wind at Belmont Pier. Busting to 30+. Got the call on VHF ch 71 from Macs. Macs is on the way out of the harbor. Long story short. Macs sailed, eventually found an alternate harbor. Everyone was safe and we met at the NYCLB club house for an official head count. Macs wins for just going out.

Tuesday 26 January: On this Tuesday we only had four boats racing. The wind had filled in nicely so we picked a longer course - course #20 at 7.8 NM. All but Swell Lover were able to make the windward Mark 36 on one tack. When Rode Rage and Raptor got to Mark 36, Macs was already far in the distance - another perfect day for Macs. The order remained Macs, Swell Lover, Rode Rage and Raptor around Marks 27, 34 and 32. At Mark 32 Swell Lover hardened up around the mark but didn't tack immediately, Rode Rage hardened up and kept going toward the Alamitos break wall. Raptor tacked immediately towards Mark 38 and even though she had to sail through Swell Lover's bad air made Mark 38 on a single tack and secured second place. Macs was 5 minutes ahead of the fleet. Rode Rage said they forgot the course included Mark 38 before the finish at the Alamitos Entrance buoy A.

Tuesday 2 February: We had seven boats racing. The wind was strong before the start, hitting 17 + knots. Several shorthanded boat decided to sail Jib Only. Raptor, with Jib only, managed to get to the windward mark first. But on the long run from Mark 36 to Mark 32 Macs, Rode Rage, and Blue Flash caught Raptor. On the reach from Mark 32 to Mark 34 California Stars ran down Raptor. On the final one sided beat back to Mark 38 Rode Rage sailed under island Chaffee and caught and beat Macs by 30 sec.

Tuesday 9 February: We had 7 boats again. Wind very light at the start. We picked the shortest course on the chart at 3.7 NM. By the time Raptor started bot were quite spread out - looked like a couple boats were already out to the wall. But wherever they were on the course the wind was light and the boats were getting headed. Everyone arrived at the first windward mark at almost the same time. Down wind from Mark 31s to Mark 34s the boat speed dropped - 2.5 knots. Blue Flash and Raptor went west. Rode Rage went east. Everybody else went down the middle; wing-on-wing. Blue Flash started sailing even higher angles - back and forth across the course - the won the most distance sailed trophy. Raptor stayed west too long and barely got back into the race. Macs got to Mark 34s first but lost out to the bigger boats that were sailing high and fast in the best breeze of the day on the way to the finish at Mark 38.

Tuesday 16 February: Flags on the Alamitos Bay Fire/Life Guard Boat Station indicated Gale Warnings. That likely explains why were only had 4 boats on this Tuesday. Winds before the start were 17 knots gusting to 21 knots. We picked course 34, a course that would not be directly into the wind. It ended up being a one tack beat from Mark 34 on the beach to Mark 31 at the outer break wall. The return from Mark 31 back to the beach was a broad reach. It turned out to be what we hoped for - a fast exciting sail. Shadowfax sailing double-handed decided to sail Jib only configuration. Macs scoffed at reefing. Rode Rage reefed the main and the headsail. Raptor started to put in the reef on the main but decided it looked too ugly. It's always difficult rating the boats that go with jib only - in light winds they don't seem to get enough time. On a day like this the J109, Shadowfax, got all the time they needed to stay out front. The first leg of the race was a reach to the beach (Mark 34). By the time Raptor started, Shadowfax was already around the first mark. The one-sided beat to Mark 31 was the most challenging with an anchored cruise ship sitting in front of the mark. Do we go around the front or around the back? Raptor when around the back - stalled the rudder. Recovered from that and realized getting to the mark would require going really high. Raptor make the mark - Rode Rage had to tack twice. That was the only "pass" made by any boat on this day. Result: Shadowfax first (horizon job), 2nd Macs - fastest speed of the day at 10.5 Knots, 3rd Raptor, 4th Rode Rage
