

The 2019 Long Beach Harbor Series is underway with two races already completed. In the Shoreline YC sponsored April Fools Race, Raptor was first to finish but after the handicaps were calculated was corrected to fourth place. The other NYCLB boat, Renegade, finished fifth. The second race was the SIBYC Ensenada Preview (night race). The NYCLB boats entered were the J109, Raptor and the Bene 44.7, Green Dragon. Green Dragon finished third in PHRF A. In PHRF B, Raptor took a DNF after hitting the bottom and needing to start the engine to get clear. What started as a 15 knot breeze and a fast trip around an oil platforms ended with 0-2 knot offshore wind and a beat into the narrow harbor entrance. challenging for all.

Tuesday's Salty Sailors sailing continues. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself, bring you friends and family – there is always a skipper in need of crew. We meet at the the club any Tuesday at 11:30. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart: dated **2 November 2018**.

The Tuesday SS results follow:


Tuesday 2 April: Three boats raced on course 57, a 7.3 mile harbor tour stating with a tight reach to mark 35, just off of the Seal Beach pier. For the second leg of the tour we sailed a fun reach to 27, the Long Beach harbor buoy 2. The third leg was a fast beat up to mark 31 on the Long Beach Breakwater, finishing with a run to the Alamitos Entrance A Buoy. The wind ranged between 8.0 and 12.0 knots. It was a fun afternoon sail with Shadowfax in first place, followed by Love & War and Green Dragon.

Tuesday 9 April: At the prerace meeting, we noticed two red pennants flying from the Harbor Patrol flagpole, indicating gale force winds. The skippers and crew prudently decided to cancel the race.

Tuesday 16 April : On this Tuesday we had six boats on course #26, a 7.5 mile harbor race east to west using two Coast Guard Buoys, (mark 24 & 27). The breeze was in the 8 to 14 knot range. In first place Windhaven followed by Dos Amigos, Swell Lover, Love & War, Green Dragon and Macs (dnf).

Tuesday 23 April: There were three boats and lots of crew on course #37, a 6.1 mile harbor jaunt. We stated off with a beat to mark 31 – east end of the breakwater, we followed that with a fun reach to mark 27 – R 2 in the center of the Long Beach Harbor. From there we headed to mark 39 – a spar buoy on the east end of Island Grissom. Our last leg, to the finish, was a fast and fun beat back to mark 38. The breeze could not have been better staying in the 8 to 11 knot range for the entire cruise . In first place Shadowfax followed by Macs and Love & War (who continued the harbor tour towards Newport).

So here we are at our Opening Day Thank you all for joining us and enjoy the rest of your stay! By Jill Cohen-Doron




Hello Members from your SUNSHINE LADY!




