Now, we are ready to be given the word that all is OPEN. Many still working have found an exceptional way to "work from home".



Race Chair Report for May 2020

On Tuesday May 26 some of our senior salty sailors from around the Alamitos Bay harbor simultaneously rendezvous at Mark 38 for a spontaneous demonstration of "social distancing" sailing. Boats in multiple different configurations sailed together: jib only singlehanded, Jib only double handed, jib and main multiple crew, jib and main single household with dodger, davits and hanging dingy!

We sailed Windhaven's favorite course, #55. First from Mark 38 to Mark 27 then Mark 37 on the outer break-wall tuning back to Mark 38 and then to the finish at the entrance of Alamitos Bay.

Three boats sailed with just jibs. In first was Windhaven, followed by Raptor and Shadowfax. Three boats used both main and jib. First was Macs followed by Swell Lover and Callisto (Callisto"s dingy was arguably the fourth boat across the finish.)

This was the forth time sailors have spontaneously gathered at Mark 38 on a Tuesday. Previous results were:

Tuesday 7 May: Well, we finally got out on the water for our Tuesday Senior Salty Sailors pursuit race. Raptor and Shadowfax rendezvoused at Mark 38 at 12:45 PM. Shadowfax was crewed by Chris and Terry, while Raptor was crewed by Heinz and Tony (rule 4a Social distancing). After not seeing any other sailing vessels approaching we decided to proceed with the race at approximately 12:50. With the wind predicted to get to gusts of 17 Knots, and with shorthanded crews, both J109 opted to race with just headsails. The course was # 53. As we headed for a starboard rounding of Mark 37, the cracking of the radio indicated that Amelieden was on the way. She started at 13:04 with main and Jib. The J109s handled quite nicely with the light crews under just the jibs. Going up wind (6+ Knots @ 27 deg). On the reach from Mark 37 to Mark 27 we were a little slow (6.1 - 6.92 Knots). Downwind from Mark 27 to Mark 32 as also a little slow even with 14+ knots wind. The last beat back to Mark 38 was the most fun. With no main overpowering us, we were still close to our target speed and angles for 14+ wind speed. Raptor finished at 14:00. Amelieden finished 19 minutes later, but with the head start Raptor had and the handicaps figured in, Awelieden corrected over Raptor.

In first place was Amelieden followed by Raptor. Shadowfax took a DNF. There was a sighting of Swell Lover but its not clear if they ran the course.

Tuesday 12 May: The second of our restart of the Tuesday Senior Salty Sailors pursuit race.

The wind was expected to be in the range of 17 knots gusting to 20 Knots, so with a double handed social distancing crew, Raptor decided to put a reef in the main. A first time configuration for Raptor. After raising the main and completing the reef we were informed by Windhaven they intend to sail under jib only - (single handing with a questionable autopilot.) Dos Amigos arrived about that time and opted to sail with just jib also.

The course was #55. First leg was a reach to Mark 27 by the Long Beach Cruise terminal. We then did a tight reach to Mark 37 on the break wall and then downwind back to Mark 38. The finish was at Mark A at the Alamitos Bay entrance. The wind was between 8 and 10 Knots all afternoon. Raptor caught Dos Amigos on the tight reach from Mark 27 to Make 37 and cought Windhaven just before the finish. Shadowfax sailed out to witness the finish and provide verbal encouragement.

Results: First single handed finish, Windhaven. First multi crewed boat sailing under jib only, Dos Amigos. First multi crewed boat sailing with everything up, Raptor.

Tuesday 19 May: Tuesday Senior Salty Sailors pursuit race:

The wind was expected to be in the range of 17 knots gusting to 21 Knots. Exiting the channel the wind did not disappoint. With the wind steady over 22 knots we were greeted with white caps and a steep chop from the west. The spray from the bow got enough salt water on the lens of the GoPro (mounted on the back) that the pictures are not usable.

Only two boats braved the conditions, Dos Amigos and Raptor. We both opted for a jib only configuration.

The course was #55, again. But this time with the wind direction from 245-260. Raptor planned to start 5 min after Dos Amigos. We arrived a the starting mark and rolled out the Jib - the tack shackle immediately opened and we spent a few extra minutes regretting our decision not to get the jib out early. First leg was a beat to Mark 27 by the Long Beach Cruise terminal. We then did a reach to Mark 37 on the break wall and then downwind back to Mark 38. The finish was at Mark A at the Alamitos Bay entrance. The wind calmed a little to between 13 and 17 Knots. Dos Amigos sailed a consistent race - Raptor was all over the place gambling to try to make up time. At the finish, Raptor was behind by 5 minutes.

Results: First multi crewed boat sailing under jib only; Dos Amigos followed by Raptor.

What's ahead for sailing this summer?

Seal Beach YC has now also cancelled Series 2 of their Thursday night Pop-Tops and hopes to start Racing on June 25 with the start of Series 3. Long Beach YC has canceled Wet Wednesday Series 1 and hopes to start Series 2 on 8 July.

Some other organizations are looking at a sailing format similar to our current Tuesday "social distancing" format. Mean while we might be the leader in getting back on the race course - so feel welcome to join us - we love seeing more boats!! Here is our current set of "guidelines".

- 1) No meeting at the club before or after the race.
- 2) Boats meet at Mark 38 by 12:45 PM, Course announced, first start at 1:00 PM.










Social Distancing When Boating




