In PHRF A fleet, the J109s, Shadowfax and Raptor represented NYCLB.

In Long Beach Race Week, J109 "Raptor" represented NYCLB and the J109 fleet in PHRF D. Raptor finished the seven race regatta 2nd in PHRF D.

Tuesday Sailing continues. The races are a pursuit style race and goal is to finish close together. This is one of the easiest ways to go racing. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself – there is always a skipper in need of crew. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart: **26 February 2018.**

The Tuesday SS results follow:

Tuesday 5 June Race: Course was #13 and the winner was J35 "Macs".

Tuesday 12 June Race: On this Tuesday, we had four boats race on course # 25, 6.3 miles, wind in the 6.0 to 10.0 knot range. In first place, Green Dragon, followed by Windhaven, Shadowfax and Macs.

Tuesday 19 June race: We had three boats race on course # 4, 6.8 miles, wind in the 8.0 to 14.0 knot range. In first place, Shadowfax followed by Macs and Green Dragon.

Tuesday 26 June race: We had a match race between the J/Boats, Macs and Shadowfax. The agreed on course was #21, an outside course of 6.9 miles. The wind range was from 10.0 to 18.0 knots. In first place, Shadowfax followed by Macs 38 seconds later.
