Hello NYCLB Membership,

Last month I invited all those who are interested to consider running for the 2020 Board of Directors or Flag Officer position. As Jr. Staff Commodore, I will soon be assembling a committee to review potential candidates and recommend a slate of officers to the Board to be placed on the ballot for next year's officers and directors.

Now is the time for those of you who are interested in running for an office to contact me with your interest and your questions.

Below is Article IV of the NYCLB Bylaws: Duties of Officers. Please read each carefully. If you have questions regarding officer duties, please feel free to contact me.

ARTICLE IV: DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Vice Commodore: It shall be the duty of the Vice Commodore, generally, to assist the Commodore in the supervision and management of Club affairs and, in the absence of the Commodore, to officiate and act for the Commodore. It shall be the specific duty of the Vice Commodore to be the Club activities coordinator and as such, shall supervise arrangements for social events, and programs for general membership meetings.

Rear Commodore: It shall be the duty of the Rear Commodore to assist the two senior Flag Officers in the discharge of their duties and, in their absence, to officiate and act in their stead. It shall be the specific duty of the Rear Commodore to act as the Club administrator and to supervise and be an ex-officio member of all administrative committees, and act as Corporate Secretary-Treasurer. In addition, the Rear Commodore shall supervise the publication and distribution of the monthly newsletter, known as the Scuttlebutt, and the annual Yearbook.

Fleet Captain: The Fleet Captain is the leader of the fleets and shall plan, direct, and supervise all training, races, competitions, and cruises; appoint, supervise, and be an ex-officio member of all fleet committees, including a Race Committee.

Directors at Large: Four directors at large and one Junior Staff Commodore

Although not included in the Bylaws, it is the responsibility of the Directors to manage the business matters of the club, to attend monthly meetings and additional meetings as may be necessary. The Commodore may also request specific Directors to take charge of various tasks or projects as they relate to club business.

Thank you all for your participation and volunteerism over this 2019 year. I hope to hear from some of you soon!

Race Chair Report for June 2019

The next race of the 2019 Long Beach Harbor Series will be the "Beat the Heat" Race conducted by Little Ships Fleet YC on Saturday 13 July 2019.

NYCLB boats are representing the club in races around the harbor. John Setchell's SC 33 "Windfall" is third overall in PHRF C after four races including the Emerald Bay races on 8-9 June 2019. and races of the Long Beach Island Series (see photo below). Shadowfax, Renegade and Dawn Patrol are racing in the SIBYC Thursday night Pop-Tops. After two of the four races in series two Shadowfax is 1st in PHRF B, Renegade is 3rd in PHRF C and Dawn Patrol is tied for 1st in PHRF D. Raptor raced in the Ullman Sails Long Beach Race Week and after seven races finished 1st in PHRF C.

Tuesday's Salty Sailors sailing continues. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself, bring you friends and family – there is always a skipper in need of crew. We meet at the the club any Tuesday at 11:30. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart: **Check for the most recent chart just out for July racing!!**

Gather up your friends and family and join us.

The Tuesday SS results follow:

Tuesday 28 May: On this Tuesday we had four boats on course #52, a 6.5 mile Long Beach Harbor cruise. We stated off on tight reach to Mark 31 – east end of the breakwater, the second leg was a reach to downtown Long Beach at Mark 39 – Island Grissom, we continued down the beach on a fun reach to Mark 32 – west end of the Alamitos Bay jetty. Our final leg was a beat back to Mark 38.

We had great wind conditions ranging between 6.5 to 12.0 knots. Three of the four boats finished within 2 minutes of each other. In first place, Shadowfax, followed by Love & War, Windhaven and Swell Lover.

Tuesday 4 June: We had six boats (two new to Tuesday sailing) on course #49, a 8.2 mile east to west Long Beach Harbor cruise. We stated off on fast pace reach to Mark 1 – Anaheim Bay Chanel Buoy #2, the second leg was a four-mile westbound reach to downtown Long Beach rounding Mark 39 – Island Grissom, finishing with a tight 2.0 mile reach back to Mark 38.

We had very good breeze ranging between 6.5 to 10.0 knots. Three of the six boats finished within 40 seconds of each other. In first place, Fait Lux followed by Dos Amigos, Shadowfax, Macs, Sorrento Siren and the Lancer 28.

Tuesday 11 June: This Tuesday we had six boats racing. We could have put two more boats on the course, but we just didn't have enough crew to sail them all! Invite more of your friends to come sailing!

The course for this foggy day was #8, a short 3.6-mile race from Mark 38 to Mark 37 on the outer break wall, to Mark 32 near the beach and then back to finish at Mark 38. Course selection was, in part, a function of the visibility in the fog. At the start visibility was from 150 yards to 300 yards depending on the start time. The breeze was light, ranging between 6 and 7 knots.

In first place, Green Dragon followed by Fiat Lux, Buenafe (new to Tuesday's), the Newport 30, Dads Dreams (a Morgan 383 also need to Tuesday's), and the Lancer 28.

Tuesday 18 June: We had eight boats on course #52, an 8.2-mile Long Beach Harbor cruise.

We stated off with a beat to Mark 31 - East end mile marker, after our starboard rounding we head off on "harbor cruise" reach to Mark 39 - East end of Island Grissom, on our next leg we followed the beach on tight reach to Mark 32 - West end of the Alamitos Bay jetty. Our last leg was a beat to the finish at Mark 38.

We had very good breeze ranging between 6.0 to 11.0 knots.

The first two boats finished within 10 seconds of each other. In first place, Buenafe followed by Shadowfax, Green Dragon, Swell Lover, Windhaven, Sorrento's Siren, Lucky Boy and Macs.

Arrival time for boats: 9 AM.


Veteranas to arrive: 9:30 AM.




