

Greetings to all Navy Yacht Club Long Beach members!

Another good news/bad news month. First the bad news: due to the restrictions of Covid-19 gatherings of people, we still cannot have large events like Friday night potlucks or celebrations of holidays.

The good news is we can meet and socialize on our club property under very strict conditions. The first and most important condition is we cannot have more than 10 people on the property at any time. I had an e-mail sent to all members last week outlining all conditions. As a reminder, they include signing in and out, having your temperature recorded, wearing face coverings, wearing your name badge, maintaining six-foot social distancing, no touching, and no sharing food. The honor bar is closed, so bring your own beverages (beer and wine only, no hard liquor). Limit your time at the club to allow others to attend and not exceed the ten-person limit. In view of the current corona virus status, I am grateful for this small change. You are all responsible adults and are quite capable of self-policing these conditions, so we don't lose this privilege.

On a brighter note, our long-awaited facility improvement program is almost finished phase one. It is good to see both the old small and large storage sheds gone. Our patio has grown usably larger. The new storage unit is compatible with the other surrounding buildings in the marina except it is superior in construction. Tony Rietdyk has already sketched out how all the storage space will be utilized for tables chairs and whatever's. When the unit is complete, we will move everything we have stored temporarily in the shipping container into our new storage. Phase two will begin as soon as we get city permits issued. That includes upgrading our electric power to a 200-amp service. That will provide all the power we will need for years to come, planning for the future. Our Long-Term Planning Committee made up of Doug Wilson, Moti Cohen-Doron, and Tony Rietdyk, deserve our huge vote of gratitude for their commitment, hard work, dedication and many hours of their own time to bring us to this point. I feel confident they will continue to see us through to the completion of our upgrade plans. When you see them, tell them how much you appreciate them.





Finally, we have some formal racing going on in Long Beach. The SIBYC Pop Tops started on June 25th. NYCLB boats racing included: Raptor, Renegade, Windfall (SC-33) and Dawn Patrol. We have finished the first series of four races. In the PHRF "A" fleet, Raptor came in first on a tie breaker. In the PHRF "B" Renegade was fourth. And in the "D" fleet Dawn Patrol was third.

Long Beach YC has canceled all of the Wet Wednesday races for the remainder of 2020. The Long Beach Harbor High Point Series has been shortened to four races. The first race, the SYCLB Dog Days of Summer Race, is scheduled for 1 August.

Tuesday Senior Salty Sailor series continues. Participation is gradually increasing. It is increasing in the number of boats, but until we can have our pre-race meetings, we are still leaving non-boatowners sitting at home without a ride!

Here are the recent results

Tuesday 30 June: The course was #20, 7.8 miles long. Wind was in the 13-18 knot range. The first windward mark was a starboard rounding of Mark 36 on the outer break-wall near Queens Gate. We then sailed on a reach to Mark 27. After that it was a downwind to Mark 34 near the Belmont pier. The next leg was a fast, 8+ knot, reach to Mark 32 followed by a beat to Mark 38. The finish was at the "A" Mark. Macs decided to run a course of their own, so we did not see them again. Raptor caught all but Swell Lover and Windhaven on the beat to Mark 36. Swell Lover won the race followed by Windhaven and then Raptor. Lucky Boy skipped the windward beat to Mark 38 and caught Raptor at the "A" Mark. Callisto II had a bit much sail for the conditions, furled the big jib for the windward leg. Finished fifth.

Tuesday 7 July: Best turnout of the year. We had 9 boats participating.

The course was #56 from Mark 38 to Mark 1 by the oil platform, then to Mark 34 by Belmont pier, back to Mark 38 and finish at the "A" Mark in the Alamitos Bay entrance. The wind for the 6.3 Mile course was 8-10 Knots. On the upwind leg from Mark 34 to Mark 38 Raptor was able to start catching boats. Turned out to be a great course where all the boats simultaneously converged on the second to last mark. Windhaven was not quite able to hold off Raptor on the reach to the finish. Dos Amigos closed the gap on Fiat Lux at the "A" Mark finish - too close to call from our vantage point. Dos Amigos thinks they just got in there. Order of finish was: Raptor, Windhaven, Calisto II, Dos Amigos II, Fiat Lux, Lucky boy Swell Lover, Macs, and Shadowfax (under jib only). (Continued...)



Tuesday 14 July: We had 7 boats participating. That included a new boat to the fleet a Dufour 36. Course #25 was requested by Shadowfax and agreed to by the fleet. Wind for the 6.3-mile course was 8-12 knots from 205-225 degrees. First leg was a one tack beat to Mark 27 (not everyone was able to make it on one tack). Shadowfax had to avoid a barge - Raptor didn't and was able to make up some ground on the other J109. Next leg was a broad reach to Mark 35 near the Seal Beach pier. Everyone started to get close together at Mark 35 with the order at that Mark; Windhaven or Macs, followed by Swell Lover and Raptor. Once around the mark the fleet soon spread out again on the upwind leg to the finish at Mark 38. Raptor was able to catch Windhaven and Swell Lover, but Mac's was able to hold on for the win! Shadowfax, Dos Amigos and the Dufour 36 were 5th, 6th, and 7th.

Tuesday 21 July: There were 5 boats that participated in the race. The course was #52 which was a beat from Mark 38 to Mark 31on the outer break wall followed by a reach to Mark 39 by Shoreline marina. From Mark 39 it was another reach to Mark 32 and final the last beat back to Mark 38 - the finish. The wind ranged from 6-12 knots on the 6.5-mile course. The boats all came together about halfway from Mark 39 to Mark 32 and then started to spread out again on the beat to the finish. First around the last mark was Dos Amigos followed closely by Raptor, so close that Raptor couldn't tack away. After a long tack on Starboard, Raptor managed to sail out from under Dos Amigos, tacked onto port for the finish and squeaked out the win by a mere 10 seconds.

The results: Humm? Finish order was the inverse of the starting order. In first was Raptor. Second was Dos Amigos II followed by Macs, Windhaven and Lucy Boy.


Hello Navy Yacht Club Family!!



IMPORTANT NOTICE!!!!

Notice to all members of Navy Yacht Club Long Beach:

After months of being without the use of our beloved yacht club facility and numerous attempts to reach out to communicate with the City of Long Beach and it's various departments we are now able to gather together under very strict conditions. These conditions are cast in concrete and must not be violated.

- 1. An absolute limit of 10 persons on the facility at any time. At no time is there to be more than 10 people on the club property.
- 2. Everyone must wear a facial mask.
- 3. Everyone must wear their name badge.
- 4. Everyone must have their temperature taken and recorded before entry is permitted,
- 5. Everyone must sign in on the attendance register. Log must be maintained and kept to record name, time in and out, temperature of each person entering the gates.
- 6. Everyone must wash/sanitize their hands every 30 minutes.
- 7. Everyone must maintain a social distance of 6 feet. People residing in the same house are exempt.
- 8. You must not shake hands, hi-fives, fist bump, elbow tap or any other physical exchange.
- 9. There is no potluck. Everyone brings their own food and will not share with anyone.
- 10. **The bar is closed. No honor bar.** You may bring your own beverage. Beer and wine only. **No hard liquor.**
- 11. The clubhouse building is closed. No entry permitted. Will be open ONLY when a board member or an appointed officer or Dorothy Owens for ships store sales items. Maximum number of persons is 2 inside the clubhouse.

The State of California, and in particular Los Angeles County has experienced an increase in the number of people contracting the Covid-19. The latest restriction laid down by the State of California is to close all indoor operations. As long as we stay outside the building and follow the above conditions, we are not in violation of the Health Department restrictions.

Because of the occupancy limit, please limit the time you spend on site to accommodate our fellow members (I think one hour is a reasonable amount of time). Also refrain from bringing <u>non-member</u> <u>guests</u>, except for those that need assistance for care. There will be time in the future when this pandemic has passed to bring friends to the club.

We have been given a small gift. Please share that gift with your fellow members and follow the above conditions so we all may enjoy the fun and friendship of our club.

Covid-19 is real and thousands of people all over our beautiful country have died from it. I hope you will exercise common sense and seriously consider is your health (life) or the health (life) of your loved one (s) worth the risk you place yourself in when you join gatherings with other people. Please exercise "Stay safer".


