The sixth race of the Long Beach Harbor Series, the "Dog Days of Summer" was conducted by Shoreline YC on Saturday 13 July 2019. In the spin class, the J109, Raptor, was first to finish but when the handicaps were calculated the C&C 110, Dos Amigos, won by 1 min 11 sec. Renegade finished third. The other Harbor Series race scheduled in August, the Pt. Fermen Race, was canceled by Seal Beach YC due to a scheduling issue with the race management team.

The next and the last Long Beach Harbor Series race will be the Navy YC Long Beach "All Hands Race" on Saturday, 21 September. Trophies for the series will be presented at NYCLB after the race.

Tuesday's Salty Sailors sailing continues. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself, bring you friends and family – there is always a skipper in need of crew. We meet at the club any Tuesday at 11:30. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart. Gather up your friends and family and join us.

The Tuesday SS results follow:

**Tuesday 30 July:** This Tuesday we had five boats on course #59, a 7.3-mile east/west tour of the Long Beach harbor:

On the first leg was a bet to Mark 31 - East end of Long Beach Breakwater, from there we sailed on at tight reach to Mark 35 - West end of the Seal Beach Pier. Our next leg was the longest of the race (3.5 miles) to Mark 27 - R2 Buoy in the center of the Long Beach Harbor Channel. Our final leg was a reach to the finish at Mark 38. The wind range was between 6.5 to 11.0 knots, ideal sailing conditions.

In first place, Shadowfax by 38 seconds followed by Green Dragon, Raptor (1minute 20 seconds) Swell Lover (4 minutes) and Lucky Boy (10 minutes plus)

**Tuesday 6 August:** For this race we had four boats on course **#52**, a 6.5 mile tour of the Long Beach harbor with the wind ranging from 14 to 20 knot plus, making it a thrilling/exhilarating sail.

Our first leg was a blustery bet out to the Mark 32 at the east end of the breakwater. On the next leg we head off on a 8 knot plus (boat speed) reach towards Island Grissom and Mark 39. As we approached thebeach and head off to Mark 32, the wind calmed down until we reached Island White where it gusted up to 20 plus knots on our way from Mark 32 to the finish at Mark 38.

In first place, Dos Amigos, followed by Raptor, Shadowfax and Lucky Boy.

**Tuesday 13 August:** On this Tuesday we had six boats on course #45, a 7.5-mile tour of the Long Beach harbor with the wind ranging from 10 to 16 knot, making it a very competitive sail.

Our first leg was a fast reach to Mark 24, the Anaheim Bay Channel Buoy GG 3. The next leg was a four mile tight reach to Mark 27, the Long Beach Harbor Center Channel Buoy R2. Our final leg was a fast reach to the finish at Mark 38.

We had a very tight fleet finishing within 2:20 of each other. In first place, Shadowfax, followed by Swell Lover (1:20) Windhaven (1:50) Green Dragon (1:55) MACS (2:05) and Fait Lux (2:20).

**Tuesday 20 August:** We had five boats and lots of crew on course #56, a 6.3 mile east\west diagonal tour of the Long Beach Harbor. The wind ranged from 6 to 11.5 knot.

The first leg was an easterly reach to Mark 1, at the Anaheim Bay Channel Buoy R2. The next leg was a diagonal sightseeing reach across Anaheim Bay to Mark 34, at the Belmont Pier. From there, the fleet headed off on a beat to Mark 38 with the option of going above or below Island Chaffee. The final leg was a run from Mark 38 to the finish at the Alamitos Bay A Buoy.

In first place, for the first time, LUCKY BOY, congratulations, followed by Windhaven, Swell Lover, Shadowfax and Green Dragon.
