

- Members who joined in 2021 or 2022 are eligible to be nominated
- Nominations are due to the Commodore by September 1
- The award will be presented at the annual General Meeting in November







Safety & Seamanship – Visual Distress Signals

Federal and state law requires that recreational vessels longer than 16 feet carry USCG-approved visual distress signals. This requirement is often met with pyrotechnic flares, either handheld flares or aerial flares shot from a flare pistol. A minimum of three flares for both day and night use are required (some flares are certified for both day and night use so you only need to carry three – otherwise you need three of each).

Flares should be stowed in an accessible location, kept in usable condition (a waterproof box is a good option) and not expired. Expired flares don't meet the requirement of the regulation so if your flares are expired you could be subject to a fine. So obviously, pyrotechnic flares need to be replaced on a regular basis (usually 42 months after manufacture). Which leaves the problem of what to do with expired flares, which are classified as Hazardous Material.

Options include:

Keep expired flares onboard as "extras." As long as you have a sufficient number of unexpired flares onboard you meet the requirement. Expired flares, especially if properly stored, may be serviceable and give you some extra signaling ability. But expired flares can become unstable, so they shouldn't be kept too long after expiration and should be stored in a clearly marked container separate from unexpired flares

Check with your local hazardous waste disposal facilities to see if they will accept expired marine flares (don't get your hopes up, most do not)

Check with your local Coast Guard Auxiliary to see if they will accept expired flares for use in training

Look for local expired marine flare collection events (like the upcoming one on September 10 in Wilmington)

Consider switching to electronic visual signaling devices which meet the USCG requirement but do not expire or generate hazardous waste

Not recommended:

Do not throw expired flares in household trash, marina dumpsters or overboard

Do not soak expired pyrotechnics in water. This does not render them safe

Do not fire them off for "practice." Even if you make the appropriate radio calls this could set off a search-and-rescue operation and you could be subject to very large fines

The Passagemaker Trophy is awarded to the Navy Yacht Club Long Beach member who has made the longest cruise during the year. If you believe you're eligible or know of another member who should be considered please let me know. Please provide a brief description of the passage including dates, destinations and distance sailed. A winner will be selected and the trophy will be awarded at the General Meeting in November.

New Event! Sunday Funday Three Hour Cruise

The idea of this event is to help get members out on the water. We will ask skippers to sign up their boats and then match them up with interested members who want to get out for a casual Sunday afternoon day cruise. We're planning an initial event for Sunday, September 25 so if you're interested in participating either as a skipper or as crew please let me know.

Fleet Captain 2023

The call for nominations is out for flag officers for 2023. Although I didn't run for Fleet Captain for 2022 but was appointed to the job when the elected individual wasn't able to serve, I have to say that I've thoroughly enjoyed being Fleet Captain and would highly recommend that anyone who's interested in helping with leadership in the club consider nominating themselves.

Please place marine flares in trunk of vehicle. Maximum weight of flares per vehicle: 30 lbs

E-flare and West Marine coupons available while supplies last. Free CA Boater Kit vouchers are available to all who participate.

ELIGIBILITY

Residence, business, or berth boat must be within Los Angeles County. Proof of eligibility is required. (i.e., license, registration, or slip fee.)

- Hand-held flares
- Aerial flares
- Smoke signals

*** NOT ACCEPTED**

- Electronic flares or electronics
- Military type flares
- Any other hazardous waste such as paint, batteries, and oil

For other electronic or hazardous waste, please call the City of L.A. Bureau of Sanitation Hotline number at (800) 773-2489 to get more information on local S.A.F.E. Centers.

Why should you dispose marine flares safely?

- Pyrotechnic flares are classified as 1.4 explosives by the DOT
- Unexploded expired marine flares are a health & safety hazard
- Many contain perchlorates, a known hazard to the environment





Long Beach Harbor High Point Series

The SIBYC Harbor Pursuit race was conducted on Saturday August 20. This race when from a start near Island Chaffee up to the LA Harbor entrance (Angles Gate) and then back around the outer break wall with the finish was inside Alamitos Bay at Navy YC. Raptor was the only Navy boat completing and finished in 8th place. The wind for the race was a pleasant 7-11 knots. But, for most of the day the wind came out of the South East (145-180 deg M). That made the upwind leg a tight reach and the downwind leg a tight reach. Only a few boats even tried flying spinnakers down the length of the breakwater. The non-spinnaker boats did well.

The next race in the series is the NYCLB All Hands Race on Saturday 10 September.

Thursday Evening Pop-Top Races - Series II

With one race to go in Series III, the Thursday evening Pop Top races are almost over. With five of six races complete, the five boats representing Navy YC are at the top of the leader board. In the PHRF "AA" fleet the Farr40, Jazz is in 3rd. In PHRF "A" the J109 Raptor is in 2nd and the J109 Shadowfax is in 3rd.

In PHRF "C" Dawn Patrol (Catalina 30) is in 1st with

Renegade in 2nd. The five NYCLB boats are also well represented in the competition for the yearly "High Point" trophy. Out of more than 60 boats currently represented, the Navy boats are: Raptor 2nd, Dawn Patrol 3rd, Shadowfax 8th, Jazz 9th and Renegade 10th.

NOTICE OF RACE

- 1. Rules: This event is governed by the rules defined in the current edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- Sailing Instructions & Course: NYCLB Course Chart OF 2022 and associated Sailing Instructions will be used. These are
 available on the NYCLB website (nyclb.org). Amendments will be posted to the Official Notice Board and NYCLB website not later
 than 1800 of the day before the race.
- 3. Eligibility and Entry:
 - 3.1. This event is open to members of all SCYA Yacht Clubs with a valid PHRF certificate. Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker classes are invited to participate. All boats shall use their Area C RLC handicaps. A boat wishing to race Non-Spinnaker shall use the non-spinnaker offset rating printed on her PHRF certificate.
 - 3.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form or entering online on the NYCLB website and submitting the required fee of \$15 (\$20 if entering after August 28) to one of the addresses below not later than September 9, 2022.
 - 3.3. This event is part of the Long Beach Harbor High Points Series.
- 4. Schedule: One race will be sailed on September 10, 2022. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first class is 1155.
- 5. Penalty System:
 - 5.1. RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty
 - 5.2. A boat may take a post-race penalty as described in U.S. Sailing Prescription Appendix V2
 - 5.3. This is the final race of the Long Beach Harbor High Points Series. Requests for redress will be subject to RRS 62.2(a)
- 6. Risk Statement & Waiver of Liability:
 - 6.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
 - 6.2. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 7. Prizes & Social: Trophies for this race will be presented at NYCLB following the race. There will be a no-host bar and refreshments.
