

How To Feed Your Jellyfish

Our JellyFuel Dry Jellyfish food makes feeding your jellyfish simple and enjoyable. We selected ingredients that meet the high protein needs of jellyfish, as well as ones that support a well rounded diet.

Preparation

To prepare some dry food, take a bowl or cup and add some water from your aquarium. Then scoop the desired amount of jellyfish food. Mix the food with water for a few seconds, until most of it sinks. Let the food sit for about 5 minutes, so that it may fully absorb water. This step is very important. Jellyfish are 95% water, so their food needs to be fully hydrated.

Feeding

There are two methods we recommend for feeding the food to your jellyfish.

1. Pour or pipette the food into the jellyfish tank. It's best to do this in an area of high flow so the food disperses quickly. Although it's tempting, do not squirt food directly at your jellyfish. Although sometimes recommended, this practice can be damaging to your pets. In nature, jellyfish slowly feed all day. A ton of food at once can overload their simple senses and they may stop feeding all together. Watch your jellyfish feed over the next 15-30 minutes. Their stomachs should all fill up with food. Use a feeding pipette to swirl up any food that settles at the bottom of the tank. Siphon any uneaten food 1-2 hours later, or the next day.
2. Method two is more labor intensive, but keeps your water quality higher and ensures your jellyfish is getting enough food. Dedicate a small bowl to your feeding. Fill this bowl about half way with some tank water. With a clean cup, scoop your jellies up and add them to the bowl. Prepare some dry food as usual, and then add it to the bowl. Swirl your jellies slightly every few minutes. Once your jellyfish appear full of food, you can add them back to the tank and throw away the water in the bowl. Because the jellyfish feed in such close proximity to the food, they may eat better this way. It's hard being brainless! By letting them eat until full in the bowl, you add no uneaten food to your tank. This will greatly help with water quality and overall tank maintenance.

Storage

Our JellyFuel food can be stored in room temperature or in the freezer. The food has an extremely long shelf life, and will not likely go bad before it is fully used. For that reason, room temperature storage is fine. If you quit keeping jellies for a while and decide to save the food, store it in the freezer.
