#### INTRODUCTION

I must make it clear that I have neither seen nor heard any of the records documented below. This means that I have had to rely entirely on original Company documents and my own research files for the information in this discography. What appears on the record label may differ from what was given in the company's files, for example there may be many variations in how the band is credited –

Band of Coldstream Guards  
Coldstream Guards Band  
His Majesty's Coldstream Guards  
Band of H.M. Coldstream Guards  
Regimental Band of HM Coldstream Guards  
etc.; etc:

John Mackenzie Rogan (1855-1932) conducted many of the records listed here but over the years his rank changed. He could be credited as Lieutenant, Captain, Major or Lieutenant Colonel, but to complicate matters if a record was re-pressed and re-labeled after some years his rank could have changed, so we have the same record with two different credits. This also applies to all other conductors, particularly the long serving ones.

I have tried to give composer credits where possible, even if they were never shown on the original record label. In most cases I am certain I have the credit correct but in some cases, where I am not sure, I have followed the credit with a query mark (?). Some titles have defied all attempts to find the composer, whilst with others I have been unable to discover the composer's full first name or initial.

Over the period covered by this discography the brand name on the label changed, starting as *Berliner*, it became *The Gramophone, Typewriter & Sister Companies*, then *The Gramophone Company* and finally became the familiar *His Masters Voice*. Popular records with a long sales life may have been issued on all three labels.

All records were 10" diameter unless otherwise stated.

#### THE DISCOGRAPHY

This is laid out in standard fashion, which should be easy for the layman to understand. I have given the location where the recording session took place as well as the most accurate recording date possible, then in the left hand column I have given the master (aka matrix) number, which was allocated by the recording expert on the day the records were made. Then follows the repertoire and in brackets the composer and arranger). The final column details all known issues of this recording. The first issue number is always the United Kingdom one, but Coldstream Guards records were issued all over Europe and elsewhere. More details on this aspect will be forthcoming. Don't forget that whatever label the recording was issued on and whatever variation of language, label name or anything else the **master number always remained constant**, although alternative takes may be used.

#### FOREIGN ISSUES

Many records by the Coldstream Guards Band were issued overseas using catalogue number prefixes that were peculiar to the country concerned. Here is the explanation
