Kristin Drysdale (@Scandiwork) is an internationally renowned expert in Scandinavian colorwork and author of the Amazon bestselling knitting book *The Nordic Knitting Primer*. Inspired by her Scandinavian heritage, she is a master of Norwegian, Swedish, and Icelandic knitting design, technique, history, and symbolism. She spent many years abroad gathering techniques in knitting circles from Norway to Austria, and has taught sold-out knitting workshops across America, Canada and Europe.

Kristin has designed for over 25 years with patterns published in *Laine Magazine*, *Brown Sheep Wool Company*, *Harrisville Designs* and *Knitters* Magazine. Her

lovely vintage cardigans, Marit and Sørensdatter, in Laine Magazine issues 7 and 12, are currently on the needles of knitters all over the world. Kristin specializes in continental knitting, colorwork, and how to make sweaters that fit. Her goal is to help knitters everywhere become independent and confident makers. She believes anyone, anywhere can learn to create heirloom garments that are beautiful both inside and out.

Kristin is a special teacher with the gift of being able to transfer her knowledge to others. She loves to share tips and tricks gleaned from a lifetime of Scandinavian knitting.



The Workshop

This workshop is for everyone. If you can knit and purl, you can take this class. If you are a proficient knitter, you will learn tricks improve your colorwork skills and learn to alter patterns make a unique version of a sweater that will fit you perfectly.

We will be working on a DK Top Down- Yoke Sweater Design especially for this class with North Lights Fiber yarn. This sweater can be made with either Water Street or Seaside yarn. This yoke sweater can be made with short, ³/₄ length, bracelet or long sleeves and can be knit as a pullover or a cardigan. The length of the sweater also is up to you.



We will talk about all versions of yoke sweaters and why designers choose to design bottom-up or top down, and the advantages of both methods. I will design a top-down yoke for this class so that we can jump right into the colorwork in class. The class will focus on gauge, ease and fit and how to make alternations to a pattern so that you tailor the fit for you. We will work on Continental knitting (picking) English knitting (throwing). We will focus on gauge magic, and how to make gauge work for you. You will learn that gauge is your friend and sweater math is a superpower that will make you a better knitter, and it will empower you to make garments that fit. We will learn all about stitch and row gauge and what this means for colorwork knitting and how you can make this knowledge work for you. We will also learn how to convert a pullover to a cardigan (just



in case you'd rather make a cardigan). I will teach you how to work invisible increases. I will teach Continental purling (my favorite way), and when and where to add short rows (my favorite way). Of course, we will be casting on (and learn how to estimate how much yarn to use for a long-tail cast on. Together we'll knit the ribbing on the neckband (and learn tricks to improve your ribbing, so that you are thrilled with the outcome from the start).

We will also be working on colorwork techniques like catching floats with the main color and the contrasting color, yarn dominance, troubleshooting stitch and row gauge, holding the yarn with one color in each hand (or two in the left hand), steam blocking, weaving yarn in and out.

The Approach

My Complete Yoke Workshop will focus on colorwork and all my tips and tricks for making beautiful fabric. I will teach you how to carry the yarn with one color in each hand, and / or carrying two colors in one hand. I will teach you lots of options. You will learn everything you ever wanted to know about catching floats (while carrying the yarn different ways). You'll learn when and where to catch floats, how to catch floats with the main color and the contrasting color, and even why catching floats is necessary. We will talk about yarn dominance and why this is important, and how this will make your colorwork knitting more



beautiful. You will learn how to switch yarn dominance when needed without dropping the yarn, for switching hands. I will teach you how and when to fix colorwork mistakes without having to rip out your work and when it's necessary how to take out a row or more and start over without dropping stitches. We will continue to talk about how to convert a pullover pattern to a cardigan, and what



that means for colorwork yoke patterns. We will talk about how to add a steek, and give you all the tools to cutting a steek with confidence. We will even practice cutting a steek, so you will be confident to do it on your own.

Finally, we will be finishing up the yoke, making sure it fits you, dividing the yoke stitches just at the right point so this sweater will fit you beautifully. We will get you started on the sleeves and the body, finishing the underarm perfectly without holes or stress points. I will introduce you my favorite way to block (which you are going to love) and we will wind up the class with finishing techniques to make your

sweater beautiful inside and out. The goal here is to complete the sweater yoke in this class. But if you don't, no worries, there is still so much to learn and do in this class, and at the end of the class you will be ready to carry-on on your own. My hope is that the sweater you make in this class will be the perfect sweater for you. I can't wait!
