Activity Pak: Make-A-State Scope and Sequence

The Make-A-State Activity-Pak offers a hands-on way to teach state history, and is designed to accompany a student's curriculum or text and encourage research. Students are given the opportunity to assemble a lap book for *any* of the fifty United States, as well as Washington, D.C. They also have access to a state fact sheet per state providing state symbols, largest cities (by population), famous people born in the state, history, and more. Finally, there is an additional file folder game that helps students learn state names, shape and placement within the country, capitals, etc. The Activity-Pak is designed to teach students through kinesthetic means, utilizing the senses and motor skills. Where younger students may need more guidance and assistance with the projects, older students should be able to handle the majority of the Activity-Pak independently.
