2022 KING'S NORTH PINOT NOIR BLEND 7 ESTATE GROWN & BOTTLED CHEHALEM MOUNTAINS

Farmed, vinified & bottled by our family to yours. Our estate vineyard is 4.3 planted acres of Pinot Noir. Small, yes, but this allows our family to farm it exclusively- keeping diligent contact with every vine from bud break to harvest.

In a word, the 2022 growing season was... challenging. A late spring frost on April 15th caused a significant loss of our primary buds as temps dipped to 27F before daybreak, leading to a substantial decrease in yield. The cold continued for much of the spring & first half of the summer, further extending the season and our eventual harvest starting late September. For a while, the vintage was paralleling the infamous 2011 vintage (the coldest growing season to date), until welcomed temps started to rise in the latter half of the season. Although this cooler vintage creates more obstacles in the vineyard, it was met with some hard nose farmers that were determined to rise to the occasion. After dropping many *literal* tons of fruit during the season to ensure quality & ripeness, we're pleased with the end result- a set of Pinot Noirs that show our site's vibrancy & elegance. A lighter, brighter Pinot with intense floral & spice notes alongside tart, fresh red fruit. These Pinots are currently showing great liveliness & energy which indicate signs of promise in the cellar.

Continuing the count: When it comes to our own vineyard, our goal is to produce the best possible wines we can, while capturing the site's own diversity & distinctiveness. Each year we will produce as many blends to meet these two fundamental requirements. And as each vintage is different from year to year, each blend we create will be too, and therefore assigned its own individual number- forever cataloging the count of hopefully a long line of uniquely delicious Pinot Noirs for years to come.

Our 2022 Pinot Noir Blend 7 is a combination of four barrels highlighting the entirety of our vineyard. Pulling from every block of our estate vineyard, this wine includes every soil, rootstock and clone- offering natural complexity with layered flavors and structure.

- 12.5% Dijon 115 (Carlton)
- 12.5% Pommard (Carlton)
- 12.5% Wadenswil (Carlton)
- 13% Dijon 667 (Dupee/Hazelair)
- 49.5% Dijon 114 (Dixonville/Carlton)
