Introduction to sentences

We use **sentences** when we speak to each other. A **sentence** is a group of words that expresses a complete thought about someone or something. A sentence begins with a capital letter and ends with a punctuation mark.

Examples: Bob ran fast.



The cat sat.



What did the **jet do? Flew** answers this question. **Flew** is the **predicate** part of the first sentence. What **did** the hen **do? Steps** answers this question. **Steps** is the **predicate** part of the second sentence.




