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





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Adding suffixes to words that need a double final consonant

1. Review Your List Words

Look at the list words below and read each word to yourself. Then review each definition.

When a one-syllable word ends with a **single vowel** followed by a **single consonant**, you need to **double** the final **consonant** before adding a **suffix**.

Example: shop + er = shopper

When a word with more than one syllable ends with a **single vowel** followed by a **single consonant**, and the **emphasis** in pronunciation is placed on the **last syllable** in the word, then you **double** the **final consonant** before adding the **suffix**.

Example: begin + ing = beginning




