Words with **oo**

1. Review Your List Words

Look at the list words below and read each word to yourself. Then review each definition.

The letters **oo** are known as a **digraph**, which is two vowels placed side by side that act together to make one vowel sound. Notice that this digraph is capable of making three different sounds: 1) the vowel sound you hear in the word **cookout**, 2) the vowel sound you hear in the word **afternoon**, and 3) the vowel sound you hear in the word **flood**.

There is no particular rule to follow in determining which sound an **oo** digraph makes. Practice makes perfect here!

afternoon	<i>afternoon</i>	• The part of the day between noon and evening.
balloon	<i>balloon</i>	• A flexible item that can be filled with air or gas.
cartoon	<i>cartoon</i>	• Drawings that depict a funny short story.
cockatoo	<i>cockatoo</i>	• A brightly colored parrot with a crest on its head.
cookout	<i>cookout</i>	• An outdoor event where a meal is cooked and served.
flood	<i>flood</i>	• An overwhelming rush of water.
foolish	<i>foolish</i>	• A decision that lacks good sense.
heirloom	<i>heirloom</i>	• A prized family possession handed down from one generation to the next.
kangaroo	<i>kangaroo</i>	• An Australian animal with long hind legs capable of leaping. Young are carried in its pouch.
troubleshoot	<i>troubleshoot</i>	• To investigate a malfunction.
cocoon	<i>cocoon</i>	• The silk covering of a caterpillar while it morphs into a butterfly.
raccoon	<i>raccoon</i>	• A small, furry animal with dark rings around its eyes that is active mostly at night.
shampoo	<i>shampoo</i>	• A liquid soap made especially to wash hair.
smooth	<i>smooth</i>	• Not rough. Having a very even surface.

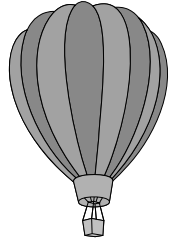

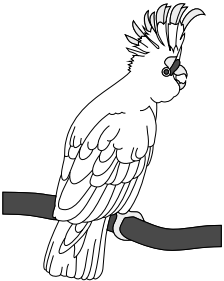

c and **g**

1. Review Your List Words

Look at the list words below and read each word to yourself. Then review each definition.

-Notice that in some words, like **custard**, the letter **c** makes a **k** sound. This is a **hard c** sound. In some words, like **cylinder**, the letter **c** makes an **s** sound. This is a **soft c** sound. If **c** is followed by **e**, **i**, or **y**, it is **soft**.

- Notice that in some words, like **glacier**, the letter **g** makes a hard **g** sound. In some words, **gymnast**, the letter **g** makes a **j** sound. This is a **soft g** sound. If **g** is followed by **e**, **i**, or **y**, it is usually **soft**.
