Calendula (Calendula officinalis) is also known as the common marigold. Calendula Infused Oil is produced by infusing calendula blossoms in either olive oil, sunflower seed oil or other carrier oil. The resulting Calendula Infused Oil combines the beneficial lipophilic properties of the calendula blossoms with the properties of the carrier oil that it has been infused into.

Common Uses: Calendula Herbal Oil is used in preparations for creams, ointments, tinctures, cosmetics, shampoo and baby wipes. It has soothing and skin softening properties, and is considered a good choice as a support oil when preparing a massage oil blend with other carrier and essential oils.

Calendula Infused Oil is widely regarded for its use as a soothing and anti-inflammatory carrier. Due to its cost and potency, it is generally combined with other carriers or used as an ingredient in soothing balms and ointments.
