

SPREAD AMONG the small cities, college towns, and county seats of Pennsylvania is a community of great musicians—fantastic artists you may not know of who get together (often driving hours to meet) and make music that is every bit as creative and excellent as their big-city, big-name counterparts.

This isn't specific to Pennsylvania—it's like this all over. Regional jazz scenes are thriving beyond the fringes of major metro areas and throughout "flyover country." We've made this modern big band record to celebrate them.

Let me unpack *modern big band* for you. *Big Band* refers to the instrumentation we use–5 saxophones, 8 brass, and a rhythm section–a standard configuration since the 1930s. *Modern* refers to the fact that the music we perform is brand new. You might say that the body of the car is vintage, but the interior and the way it handles are totally up-to-date.

I've been involved with modern big band music for 30-odd years, ever since high school. And I've been writing music like this for 20, so I've had a lot of time to think about recording an album. But, the logistics of pulling this off–especially with the musicians spread so far and wide–seemed daunting.

When the pieces of the puzzle came together in early 2016, my first move was to assemble the dream band. I called up 20 of my favorite musician-friends, all with strong ties to Central PA, where I have lived for the past 17 years.

Because I know these musicians well, I have the luxury of writing them into musical situations in which they'll really shine. Like Alex's accordion work on *Tango*, Steve's improvised intro on *Wonderful Tonight*, Greg's soprano solo on *Old Chief*, and the Beck-Lowe rhythm team on *Giddyup!* and *Metroliner*.

Equally important is the fact that we all like each other. The feeling of mutual respect and love is clear when you listen to the album.

Ultimately, we hope that your day will get a bit brighter when you listen to this music. And that you are able to appreciate and support the regional jazz scene in your neck of the woods.

ABOUT THE MUSIC


GIDDYUP! is here to get you moving right out of the gate. And if you're keeping score, the first half of the tune is in a modified *rondo* form. All bets are off after that.

POCONO GIT-DOWN is an ol' timey Saturday night barn dance. Come together, let your hair down, and have a good time.

A long-stemmed rose may come in handy for TONIGHT, WE TANGO.

THE OLD CHIEF'S LOOKOUT portrays Hollidaysburg, Pennsylvania's Chimney Rocks a few hundred years ago, when the land was inhabited by Susquehannock indians. All is calm in the valley below—until it isn't.

WONDERFUL TONIGHT is simply a pretty song. I changed a few of the harmonies, but otherwise left the tune intact.



The **METROLINER** was a high-speed train connecting Washington, DC and New York City. The tenor starts our journey, with drums, bari, and the other saxes getting on at successive stops. Then we're really rolling.

THE WITCHING HOUR is that time in the quiet of the night when the ghosties and ghoulies come out to play. It also occurs when toddlers stay up well past their bedtimes.

If you've got to make the trip from State College to Huntingdon-and you feel like dancing-you just might **MAMBO OVER THE MOUNTAIN**.

THE WAY YOU MAKE ME FEEL is dedicated to you. It should really be The Way You Make Us Feel. Dig the individual statements from about half the band in this arrangement.
