Artist's Notebook

The Harlequin is certainly an advanced decoy, but with patience even a beginner can achieve an effective paint pattern. Remember: these are gunning decoys; they don't have to be perfect, they just have to work!

Painting Instructions

- 1. Prep the entire decoy in accordance with the decoy painting instructions, prime with gray Parker Decoy Primer. Draw lines using a pencil.
- 2. Paint the bill, head, neck, chest, and back using Slate Blue (60). Once dried mark off the White paint patterns with a pencil.
- 3. Paint the side pockets using Redwood Brown (37).
- 4. Paint in the wing patches with White (2).
- 5. Paint the rump and tail with Black (5).
- 6. Use a small, fine round brush to paint the thin Black (5) lines into the White (2) wing patches.
- 7. Shade the chest and front of head with Blue (7) using the dry brush technique.
- 8. With a small round brush and using the dry brush technique, apply black shading around the white patches on the front half of the body and the head.
- 9. Paint in the rest of the small White (2) areas you just shaded around.
- 10. Paint the crown of the head using Black (5) and the small stripe of Redwood Brown (37).
