hosted at St Kilda, having previously been based at Sandringham Yacht Club, Yachting Victoria chief executive Steve Walker said.

But they were keen to move the regatta to a more public space, he said.

"As well as showcasing these world-class sailors and letting the sailing community have access to them, we also hope to use it as a platform to introduce new people to the sport," Mr Walker said.

Sailors from Great Britain, Germany, Italy, US, Sweden, Ireland and Norway are among the 23 counOlympic sailing disciplines.

The Melbourne regatta includes youth, giving young sailors such as 12-year-old Linus Talacko from St Kilda the chance to mill about the boat park with their heroes.

Linus, who has been named an ambassador for the event, said it was a thrill to have the world's best sailors coming to his patch.

"It would be pretty cool to meet them," he said.

Linus will be racing his Opti dinghy in the regatta.

Mums go all out to raise money for baby-care items

ST KILDA Mums is making a last-ditch bid to raise funds for essential baby-care equipment including cots and car restraints before Christmas. The organisation had a wait list of more than 250 such big-ticket items for about 100 families in the last week of November, according to chief executive officer Jessica Macpherson.

Many were items it did not

have in stock and would have to purchase in order to get them out in time to those in need, she said.

While the organisation received many donations of second-hand goods such as prams, Ms Macpherson said they required time and often money to fix, and they did not currently have much of either.

"It has become very pressured for us — we close for three weeks over Christmas and then a lot of social

workers don't work for part of January."

Items on the wait list last week included 67 cots and 20 bassinets, Ms Macpherson said.

Stolen number plates are also often used to commit other offences, such as stealing fuel from petrol stations or for travelling on tollways without paying, he said.
