WHERE DOES FAITH GROW?

FAITH GROWS AT HOME!

All people are disciples. Disciples are simply followers of someone leading. The real question is: Who is doing the discipling in your child's life? According to Deuteronomy 6 (along with many other portions of Scripture), you have been called to do the discipling. This chapter is such an important part of the Bible for us as parents. The LORD makes it clear — we are to diligently teach our children how to love Him. We are to talk of Him and His commands when we are sitting, walking, lying, and rising. When our children ask us questions about our faith, He wants us to share the testimony of His goodness in our own lives. This doesn't naturally happen on its own; discipleship is intentional. When we look at the life of Jesus, we can see that God's model of training is discipleship. Jesus didn't hand a book to 12 men and walk away. He lived with them, ate with them, taught them, and experienced life with them. He was there for the highs and the lows and continued to point everything back to the Kingdom of God. In Matthew 16:5-12, the disciples realized they had forgotten bread to eat. In this very down-to-earth moment, Jesus decided it was time to teach an important spiritual lesson to them that had nothing to do with filling their physical stomachs. Discipling was at the top of Jesus' agenda.

This is the heart of the *Where Faith Grows* series.

I'm a second-generation homeschooler and I grew up in a strong Christian home attending church multiple times a week. Sadly, so many of the peers I attended church with have since walked away from the faith. This is a heart-wrenching fact that has played itself out countless times in the lives of church-attending teenagers becoming adults. According to the American Worldview Inventory 2020, conducted by the Cultural Research Center at Arizona Christian University, only 6% of American adults today have a biblical worldview. While this is shocking, it is even more shocking to discover that only 5% of those aged 37-55 possess a biblical worldview and, even worse, only 2% of Americans aged 18-36. In the mid-1990s, approximately 12% of American adults possessed a biblical worldview. Why the sharp decline? Where is the disconnect? Dr. George Barna commented on the results of the American Worldview Inventory 2020 that this is a dire warning sign and dramatic changes are necessary. He has advised parents of the youngest generation (those born after 2002) to evaluate and take any necessary steps to shape the worldview of their children. According to Barna, this evaluation should include the investment parents are making in a child's life (morally, spiritually, emotionally, and in regard to character, values, etc.). He says that his decades of worldview research indicate that worldview is established between the ages of 15 months and 13 years.

YOU ARE CALLED TO DISCIPLE YOUR CHILD!

We have depended too long on the local church to disciple our children. The local church is absolutely necessary and beneficial to our faith but the main responsibility of the discipleship of children falls on parents. We have a short window of opportunity to pour into our children the foundational truths of our faith. As children mature into adults and their brains develop, learning new things becomes more difficult. This is a challenge that Jesus understood when He said for an adult to enter the Kingdom of Heaven, he has to become like a child (Matthew 18:3). Children have great faith! This is the time when they are impressionable, this is when we must make “the most of our time, because the days are evil” (Ephesians 5:16).

Once you understand your calling, it’s time to get intentional. *Where Faith Grows* becomes a tool in your hand as you lead your child into all God has for them. You don’t need another activity book, you need the tools to be successful in implementing a pattern of discipleship. *Level 1* works to set a strong foundation in understanding who God is and how He works in our lives. As you work through this course and allow discipleship to become a part of your everyday life, remember these words of God in Isaiah 54:13-17:

*“All your sons will be taught of the LORD;
And the well-being of your sons will be great.
In righteousness you will be established;
You will be far from oppression, for you will not fear;
And from terror, for it will not come near you.
If anyone fiercely assails you it will not be from Me.
Whoever attacks you will fall because of you.
Behold, I Myself have created the smith who blows the fire
of coals
And produces a weapon for its work;
And I have created the destroyer to inflict ruin.
No weapon that is formed against you will succeed;
And you will condemn every tongue that accuses you in
judgment.
This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD,
And their vindication is from Me,” declares the LORD.*

UNDERSTANDING THIS COURSE

Your student will be introduced to Abigail and Nehemiah in the first lesson. Abby and Miah (their nicknames) will be meeting up with your student four days per lesson (days 1, 2, 3, and 6) to share the new concepts they are learning as they are disciplined by their parents. The dialogue is written to flow like a natural conversation.



Day 1 – The first day of each lesson will introduce a memory verse and an activity to help your student remember the verse. Memory practice will continue each day of the lesson. You can find a complete list of the memory verses at the back of the book with the option to check them off or place a sticker next to them as your student masters each one. The verses are included in this course in either NASB or NIrV but if you prefer a different version, you can adapt the assignment.



Day 2 – The second day will continue with your student learning more of what was started on the first day of the lesson.



Day 3 – The third day will always incorporate some type of game or activity to bring what your student is learning to life. These activities use simple household supplies. The supply list includes everything you will need for each activity.



Day 4 – The fourth day is a time to sit down with your student and have a direct conversation with them. There is a script included in the course and you will also be reading from an additional book. Do this in whatever way feels most natural to you. If you enjoy cuddling on the couch together, by all means, go for it!



Day 5 – The fifth day is a short day of application with plenty of extension ideas to take the learning further.

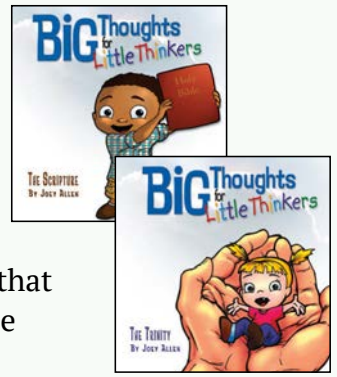


Day 6 – The sixth day is where you will review what you have covered throughout the lesson. Each review day will have your student creating an art piece of their choice based upon what was learned.

TIME IN THE TRUTH: This section will be found on day 1, 2, or 3 each lesson. It will either be direct Scripture or a summary based on several verses. The references are always listed below if you would like to read directly from your Bible. Your student will be learning that we find out who God is and how He instructs us to live by reading Scripture.



BIG THOUGHTS SERIES: *Big Thoughts for Little Thinkers: The Scripture* and *The Trinity* are essential resources for this course. You will be reading a small portion of one of these books on day 4 of each lesson. There are two other books in this series (*The Gospel* and *The Mission*) that would also be a great addition to your home library.



LET'S GO DEEPER! — The heart behind *Where Faith Grows* is to give you the tools to make discipleship a part of your everyday life. The Let's Go Deeper! ideas on day 5 allow you to pick and choose ways to take the concepts further and allow more members of your family to be involved. These are not required in order to complete the course but they are recommended. You can use these ideas on whichever days work best for you.

JOURNAL THIS! — How can you track your student's faith journey in a tangible way? This is where journaling comes in! At the back of the course, you will find one front-and-back journaling page per lesson. Throughout each lesson, there are prompts to help you fill in those pages. Some of the prompts will have you writing down your student's actions, while others will have you discussing and recording their responses. You will even have opportunities to share your personal faith journey with your student! The prompts are included to provide a framework that you can build upon. Feel free to pick and choose which ones to use or you can be as creative as you'd like with the journal. While the majority of the written work will be done by you, your student will be joining you in creating this treasure. He or she will be able to color, trace, or doodle about the attribute of God covered in each lesson. At the bottom of the journal page, you will notice a place to paste a snapshot. Grab a selfie of you and your student each lesson as you are reading together or completing an activity. Then print it out and have your student cut and paste it on the page. You're doing the discipling, so be sure to include yourself in these photos! I would absolutely love to see your snapshots in the Master Books app and in the *Moms of Master Books* Facebook group. When you share, hashtag your photos with #growingfaithathome!

As you work through the course, you will begin to put together a keepsake documenting the beautiful journey of faith your student is on. This element of the course will follow through all the levels of *Where Faith Grows* so you can see the growing faith of your student from *Level 1* through *Level 6*. You can pull these pages out to create a faith journey binder for your student and add extra pages in as needed.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

This course is written for you to do with your student. This isn't the same as a math or language textbook — even if your student is reading well and enjoys independence, they need you for discipleship!

Children respond well to verbal affirmation, physical touch, and rewards. Throughout the course, you will find some areas that rewards are recommended. Feel free to add in any extra ones that you desire. A reward for each Bible verse memorized is a great motivator!

The nature of God is so complex. The concepts covered in this course are taking complex characteristics of God and breaking them down in a way that a young child can understand. Some children are ready and asking for more than what will be covered here. In this case, please use the lessons as a launching pad for discussions that can go as deep as you'd like to take them.

Be sure to keep conversation and connection open with your student and be willing to answer their questions about God. If you don't know the answers, be honest and try to find them together. Just as Abby and Miah's parents are regularly reading the Bible and having God show them new things, the same happens in our lives. We will always be learning more about God. Remember, the best way to answer questions is with Scripture!

As you become more comfortable with discipleship, incorporating a family devotion time encourages your entire family to grow together. Master Books offers many great resources for this, including ready-made "Morning Basket" options.

If you would like to record a grade for this course, I recommend grading based on the following subjective questions: Is your student showing interest in the topics covered? Is your student participating willingly and with a good attitude in the activities? Can your student share what they are learning back with you in an age-appropriate manner?

If you prefer a more objective grade, you can use mastery of the memory verses for grading purposes.

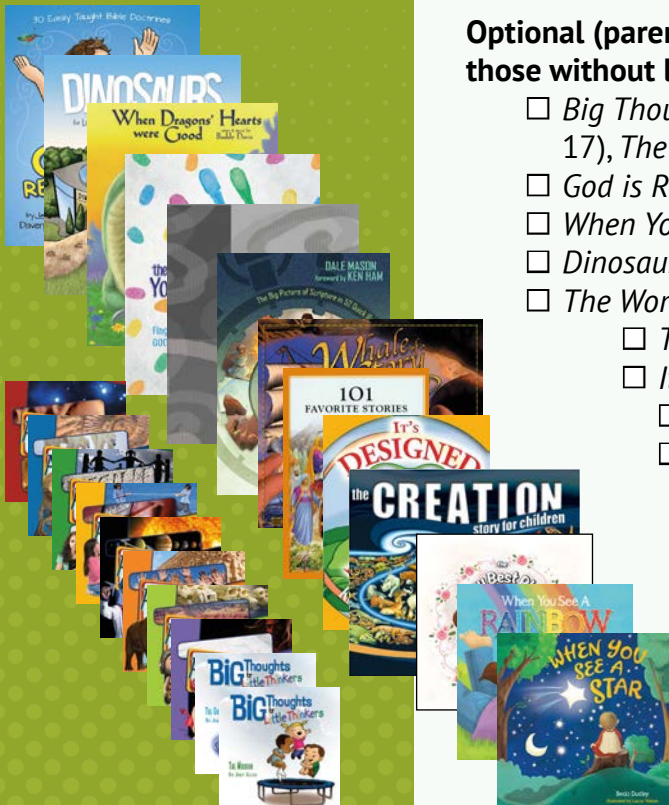

Abby: Hi! I'm Abigail, and this is my brother, Nehemiah. Dad and Mom call me Abby for short, and they call my brother Miah. Do you have a nickname? The neat thing about names is that our parents picked them out special just for each one of us!



Miah: Names are so special that the Bible even says God knows us by our names. Mom gave us a memory verse to work on this morning. It says in Isaiah 43:1, "I have called you by name; you are Mine!" Isn't that amazing to think about? The God who made everything knows *my* name! This is definitely my new favorite Bible verse.

Note to Teacher:

Isaiah 43:1 is specifically referring to God calling the nation of Israel by name. Just as God knew Israel by name, He knows our names (John 10:3, 14).

Abby: It's hard to pick a favorite Bible verse because there are so many good ones! I have fun learning more and more of them.

Miah: I like learning from the Bible, too, but I'm not sure why we read it so often. We read and talk about it every day! I'm going to ask Dad about that during our family devotions.

Abby: Mom told me she is still learning from her Bible every day, even though she has been reading it since she was a little girl. It seems like she would know everything about the Bible by now! I'm going to ask her tonight how that is possible.

Miah: Wow, I think we still have a lot to learn about the Bible if Mom doesn't know everything. Maybe that is why we talk about it every day. I can't wait to hear what Dad and Mom tell us! We'll be sure to tell you what we find out. We should practice our new memory verse all together, so we don't forget it.

Abby: I have an idea! We can say it three times, starting out with a whisper and getting louder each time! We'll crouch down really low at first and then end the last time on our tippy toes. Will you help us learn it?

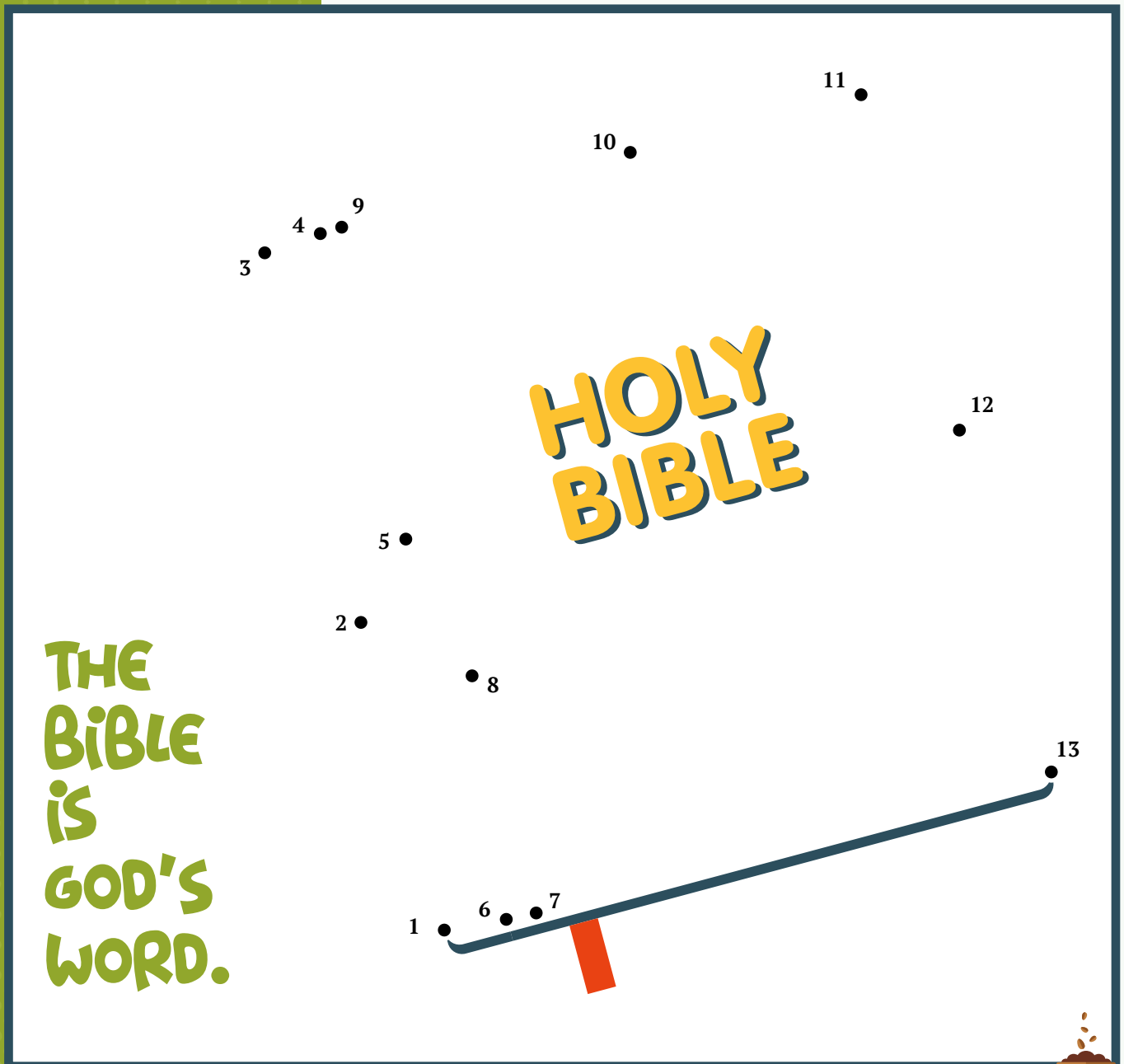
God is Trustworthy

Abby: I can't wait to tell Mom how we showed that we can commit to something. She will be proud of us. She commits to reading her Bible every day. I remembered to ask her how she keeps learning new things from the Bible, and she told me something really cool. She said it is because every time she reads it, it gets deeper into her heart, and God shows her things she hasn't seen before. He actually talks to her through the Bible! Wow!

Miah: Now I know why she wants to read it every single day! I'm excited to let God's Word go deeper into my heart during family devotions tonight.

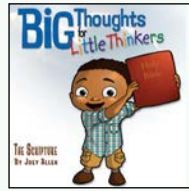

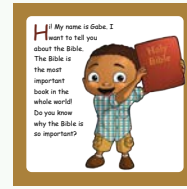

Our book today told us that we can only know God if He tells us about Himself. Do you know where God tells us about Himself?

(Student's response) *The Bible*

You're right! That's why we read the Bible, to know more about God. It says in Isaiah 1:2, "Listen, O heavens, and hear, O, earth; For the Lord speaks. . . ." Did you hear the first word in that verse? It was listen! He wants us to listen when He speaks. When God speaks, we can trust what He says. We know that God never tells a lie. He only tells the truth. That means He can be trusted. We can count on everything He says. Do you remember what God said to us in the memory verse we've been learning? Let's say it together!

Grab the things you need so we can play! Maybe we will be better this time than the first time we played. Are you ready? 1, 2, 3, GO!

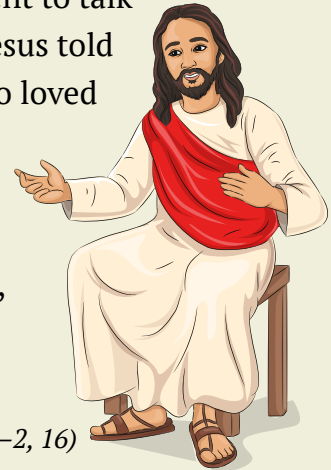
Miah: Before we start reviewing what we've learned, Dad taught us one more thing from the Bible that we have to share with you.



• TIME IN THE TRUTH •

There was a man named Nicodemus living during the time Jesus was on earth. Nicodemus wanted to learn more about who Jesus was so he went to talk with Jesus one night. Jesus told Nicodemus, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

(Summary based on John 3:1-2, 16)



Abby: Dad said Jesus is the Savior that God promised all the way back when Adam and Eve sinned. Do you remember when we learned about that? Jesus is God's Son and He came to take away our sin. When we believe in Him, ask for His forgiveness, and turn away from sin, He saves us! That means we get to have eternal life with God!

Miah: This is the best news in the whole world! Even though we've sinned and been separated from God, He made a way that we can be with Him again. God is eternal. He has always been and He will always be. The good news is that when we believe in Jesus, we can be with Him forever too!



Abby: Mom gave us a new memory verse to help us remember what Jesus did for us. First John 2:25 says, “This is the promise which He Himself made to us: eternal life.” God kept His promise and sent the Perfect Sacrifice for our sins – Jesus. This verse makes me so happy that I want to sing it! I think we should practice by singing the verse. Can you make up the melody?

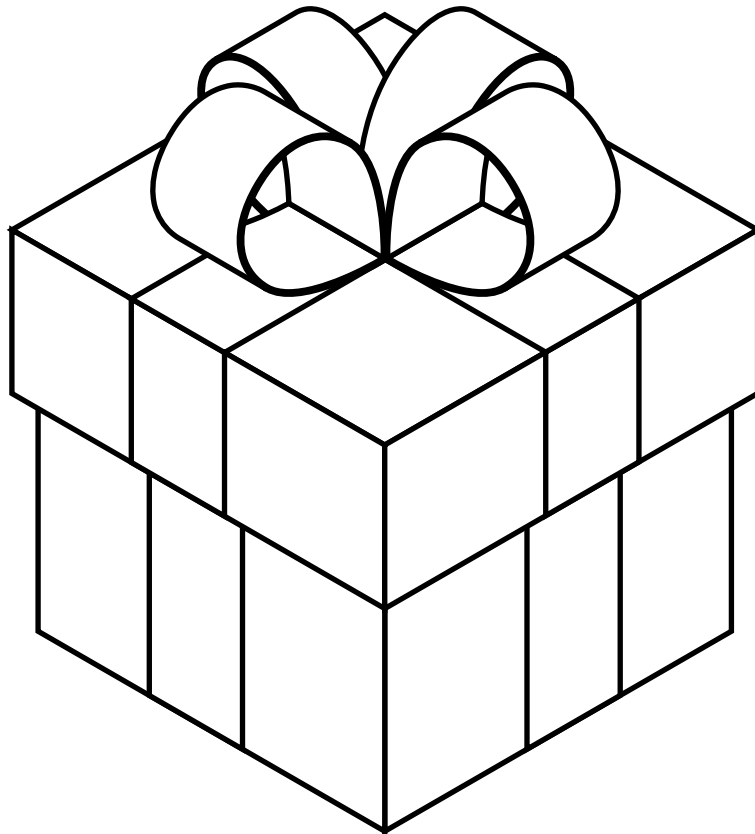

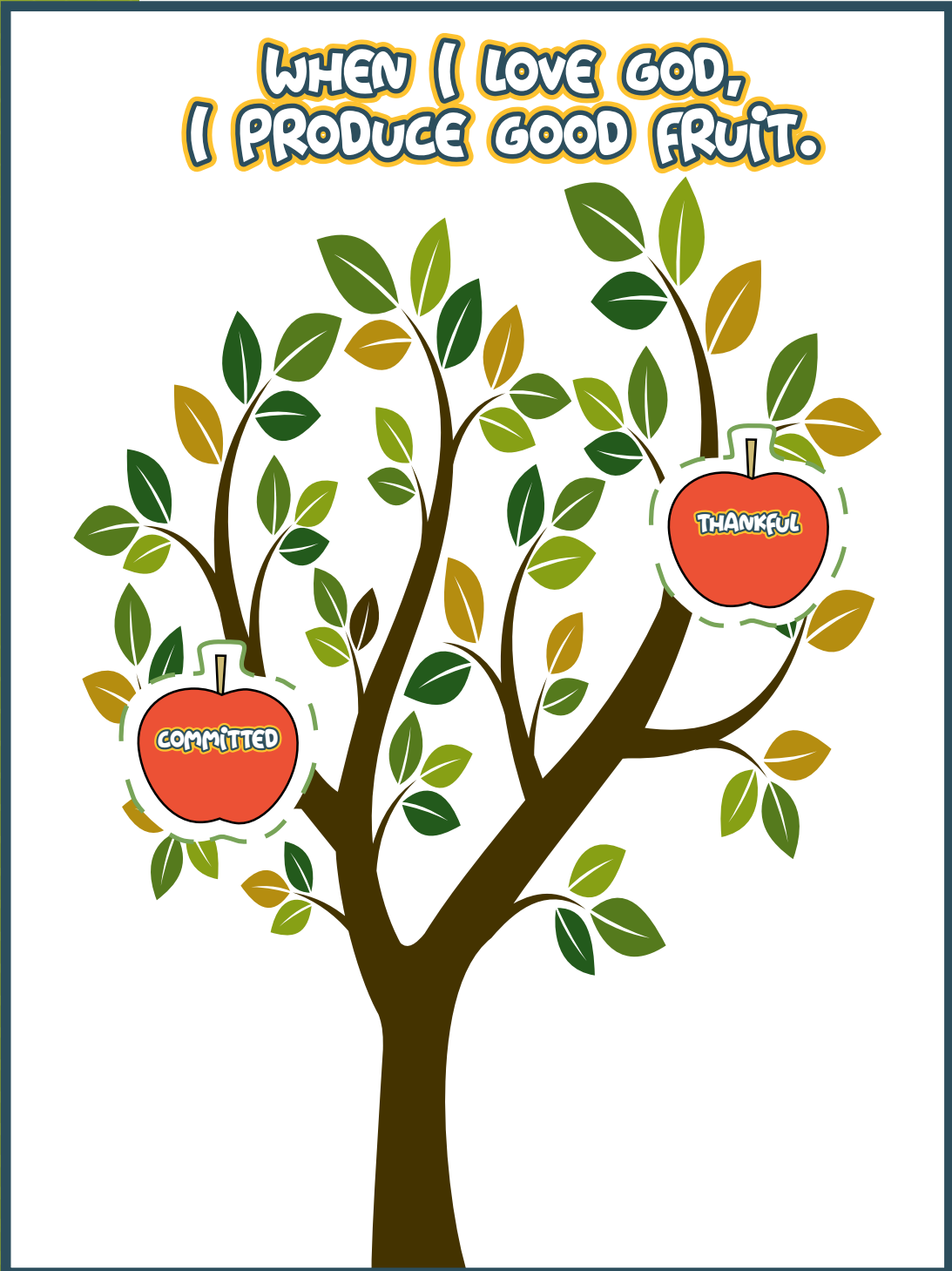

Note to Teacher: Help your student identify a time when they exhibited patience.



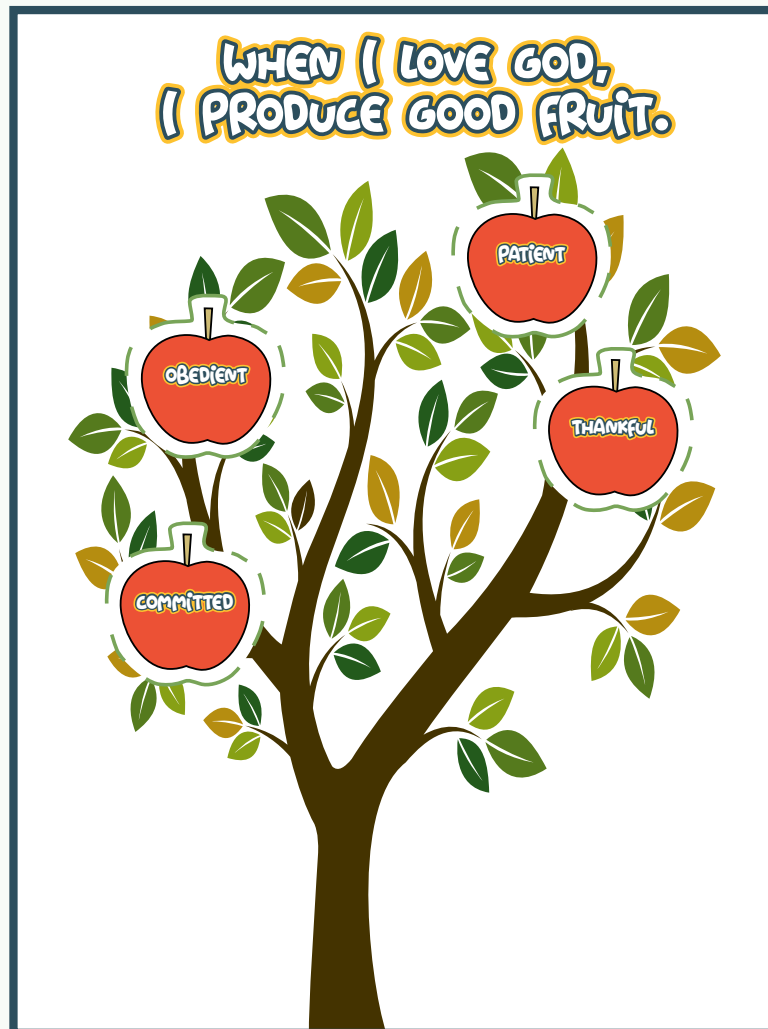

DISCIPLESHIP EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

LESSON 1



Work with your student on something that is difficult for them and highlight the idea of being committed with God's help. If they're learning to make their bed, work alongside them and discuss how when we choose to commit to something, it might be hard at first but it begins to get easier. Other ideas that you can use to highlight being committed are learning to ride a bike, tying shoelaces, setting the table, etc.



Play a couple trust games to show that we can always trust God – blindfold your student and lead them through a maze of toys on the ground. Have your student face away from you with their eyes closed and arms crossed, instruct them to keep their knees locked and fall backward and you will catch them. Just like you led them safely through the maze and caught them when they were falling, God is always there for us. We can trust Him.



Tell your student a testimony of a time that you trusted God in your life.



Read *God is Really, Really Real* – specifically the portion on the Bible.



Read through the verses listed on the bottom of the pages read in *Big Thoughts for Little Thinkers: The Scripture* this week.



Listen to the hymn "I Know Whom I Have Believed."

LESSON 2



Read the story of Abraham and Sarah from Genesis 12:1–7; 15:1–6; 17:1–8, 15–19; 18:1–14; 21:1–7.



Go outside on a clear night to look at the stars. Try to count as many as you can and discuss Abraham's descendants being as numerous as the stars.



Continue working with your student on things that require commitment. Offer a lot of praise!



Model commitment and discuss areas in your life where you have committed to various things.



Tell your student a testimony of a time when you trusted something God said in the Bible and He came through on your behalf.



Read *God is Really, Really Real* – specifically the portion on God.

LESSON 9



Read the story of Nicodemus meeting with Jesus from John 3:1–21.



Your student will be making up their own tune and singing the memory verse this lesson. Singing is a powerful way to remember Scripture. There are many verses put to song that you can find by doing an internet search. Look up some songs to share with your student and listen to them together. You will be amazed at how easy it is to memorize verses this way! Please note: We do not recommend that you allow your student to search the internet. Please search beforehand and prescreen every song.



The Bible story and concept of God from this lesson might bring up questions from your student about salvation. If your student is asking questions about the Savior or ready to learn more, share the gospel message with them. *Big Thoughts for Little Thinkers: The Gospel* is a great resource on this topic.



Read *The Door of Salvation*.



If your student is having a hard time remembering what is discussed during the review portions of this lesson, turn back to the lesson they are struggling with and add in some of the Let's Go Deeper! ideas.



Add in the activities that were done on the previous lessons if you'd like to extend the review portions for the character traits.



Share your testimony of salvation with your student.



Read *God is Really, Really Real* – specifically the portions on forgiveness and salvation.



Read through the verses listed on the bottom of the pages read in *Big Thoughts for Little Thinkers: The Scripture* this week.



If your student does not have their own Bible yet, this would be a great time to gift them a Bible.



Read through the entire book *Big Thoughts for Little Thinkers: The Scripture* again.



Listen to the hymn “Blessed Assurance.”

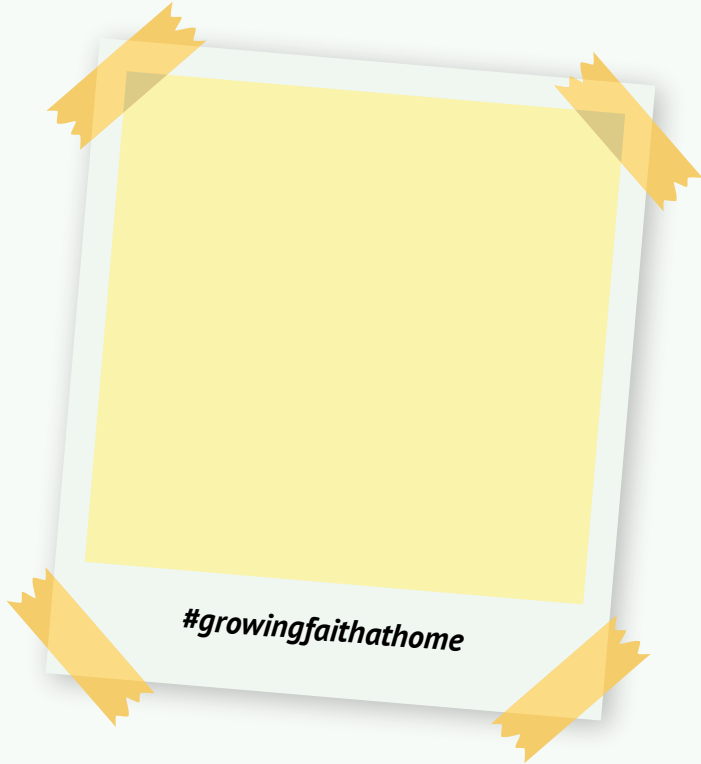
