

Introduction

Please note: each map page is blank on the back side, so you can feel free to colorize any way you wish, and the page number corresponds directly with the related *Map Trek Atlas* for ease of use. Also, on the maps with grid lines, a student is meant to draw in all the corresponding lines of the country boundaries.

This book contains blank maps on perforated pages that can be torn out easily and used by students for additional coursework or drawing exercises from the information in the *Map Trek Atlas*. The maps can also be used as reviews or testing to assess knowledge of the history of the world.

Used alongside the Map Trek Atlas, students can use this outlines map book to:

- Traw in and colorize the political boundaries, major cities, battle sites and more from each historical time period
- \$\ Label places of historical significance on their outline maps, including empires, ancient travel routes, and explorers

Student maps ready to label and color include:


