2. **Read John 20 v 30-31.** Why did John write his Gospel?

DICTIONARY

Signs (v 30): miracles.
Messiah (v 31): the all-powerful, eternal King promised throughout the Old Testament.

- **Read 4 v 13-14; 10 v 10.** What is the “eternal life” that belief in Jesus offers like?

▶ **Read John 1 v 1-18**

3. What do we learn about the Word?

DICTIONARY

The Word (v 1): God the Son; Jesus Christ.

His own (v 11): the Jewish people.

Glory (v 14): God's awesome presence.

• What is the Word's relationship with God?

Which single verse from this section will you memorize and call to mind throughout each day to remind you of who God is and who you are?

▶ **Read John 1 v 19-37**

4. What does John (not the Gospel writer!), who "came as a witness" (v 7), tell us about Jesus in these verses?

DICTIONARY

Testimony (v 19): evidence.

Elijah (v 21): an important Old Testament prophet.

The Prophet (v 21): In the Old Testament God promised to raise up a prophet greater than Moses (see Deuteronomy 18 v 15).

5. How do you think these verses should make us feel about Jesus Christ?

6. John's message can be summed up as, *Not Me But Him*. What would it look like for us to live that way in our lives?

▶ Read John 1 v 37-51

7. Who do Andrew and Philip realize Jesus is?

DICTIONARY

Son of Man (v 51): Jesus often used this title to refer to himself (see Daniel 7 v 13-14).

8. What is one of the first things that they both do next?

🗣 getting personal

Andrew is less well known to posterity than Simon (or, as he is usually called, Peter), but without Andrew's ministry of bringing there would have not been Peter's ministry of preaching. If we do not have Andrews then, under God's providence, we are unlikely to have Peters. You may not be a Peter, but you can be an Andrew.

9. What does Jesus promise Nathanael (v 50-51)?

➤ Read John 1 v 51

According to Jesus, where is this place where heaven touches earth—where we find a stairway to heaven?

10. What is the purpose of Jesus' miracle here (v 11)? What is the right response to it?

11. What do you think the choice of event, and the type and amount of wine produced, are meant to tell us about Jesus and life with him?
