How am I to Read a Book?

Interview with Tim Challies

We were talking just before the interview about how you were reviewing about a book a week and reading even more than that. Most of us struggle to even read a few books a year, how do you get time to do that and how do you approach reading a book?

Reading is a habit that you have to form in all of life. People who say they don't read, or that they don't have time to read, need to realise that you have to take the time from something else. So, if you're not reading and you want to read more then you have to scale back on Netflix, or gaming or some other hobby and commit

it to reading. I think once you get into the reading habit you start to build the discipline and it gets easier. It's like most things...people don't read very much so they're not very good at reading which sounds

odd but it is a skill that you develop. They quit too early instead of really learning to develop the habit and start to do it as a lifestyle of being a reader.

Are there any tips you'd give about reading a book and how to start?

I think there is a lot of value in the old method of skimming over it and then going back and "deep" reading. I think a lot of people get hung up on, "I have to read the entire book." I think there is nothing wrong with abandoning a book half way through if you're not enjoying it, or it's not good. Just cut your losses and go find another book and read that. So, there's no necessary value in finishing a book. John Piper said, "Books don't change people, sentences do." So, if you're reading a book and you get one solid idea out of that book it is well worth whatever you spent on it and whatever time you gave it. As I look back on my life and the things I say, or things I believe in I can often trace it just a sentence or two to a book. There are very few books where the entire book has shaped me. Often it's just a line here or a line there which goes down deep and somehow changes your life.

You yourself are a blogger. And it seems that today we live in an age of blogs and video content. There's unending resources out there in this digital world. With all that available to us why should we even bother going to a book when it's much easier to go to a blog or watch a video?


I think the main benefit of books is that there's a whole development process that goes into making a book. So, when

> people say, "Blogs are eventually going to replace books" they don't know what they're talking about, because those are different media. Blogs are quick and urgent and largely unedited. Books go through

this long laborious process of research and writing and editorial. Most people don't know this but when you submit a book to a publisher it's usually six to twelve months before that book is actually released, and in that time, it is going through this very thorough process. So, I think books offer a much deeper, more editorialised view of a subject. Whereas blogs are very urgent. So, somebody passes away today, we can write a blog about their life tomorrow. But the more in-depth and thoughtful approach will be a year later when we've actually written a book about that.

Chris, what prompted you to write this book?

Interview with Chris Cipollone

Personal experience is the short answer. Depression and anxiety is a topic close to my heart. Particularly depression is something that I have lived with for almost 10 years now,

I would say. Long story short, I ended up in a psychiatric clinic towards the end of my theological studies and I began preaching what I had learnt to myself. What would I say to somebody in my

situation was the question I began to ask. I had read thing on the topic in the Christian space before. Great resources, many that I would highly recommend. But I think what is distinctive about this book is I have shown a lot of

myself. So it's not just pure theology. It's personal experience and how theology interplays with that. So, my hope is that it will be something that is relatable to people and to be honest I wouldn't have written it if I thought I didn't need to. It was a gap that I saw and in Christ I feel secure to share that vulnerability. So if that's a blessing to other people that will be great.

You definitely achieved that end. As I read it, it's very pastoral. It's not textbook on counselling or depression. I very much felt that you were speaking to me through it.

Should I only pick up this book if I am suffering depression - will it be helpful for me in that situation or are there other situations that it might be helpful for?

Good question. It's obviously come out of my own experience as someone who is suffering but my hope and prayer is that this is also a resource for pastors, for friends, for family members, churches who are trying to understand what it looks like to live with depression and anxiety. Every story is different and the brain is a complicated thing but my hope is that for somebody

> who is not living with it, in stepping into my shoes for a moment, they might be able to understand a little bit of what their loved ones are going through. So what I say at the start of the book is 'whether you are somebody who is living with depression and

anxiety, somebody who wants to know how to care for someone who is or even if you are cynical about it and you think – is this really a thing - to each of those groups of people I say thank you for reading it.







"Books for teenagers are not just found in the children's section. Expand their (your) reading by finding some easy-to-read "adult" books (general books!) and seek for teenagers to be built up in maturity in Christ – moving from milk to solid food."

> **Books for Teenagers** Review by Andrew Deligiorgakis

What I frequently hear from people is "there doesn't seem to be many good books for teenagers". At an age where teens are moving from childhood to adulthood, it's difficult to know what books would be beneficial. Here is my selection of books for teenagers.

One book that may have surprised you on my list is "Concise **Theology**" by J.I. Packer (\$16.99 Paperback). This book is a staple for all bookshelves and should most certainly be read by teenagers. It is a systematic theology book that is in small portions of about 2 to 3 pages per topic. It's full of scripture, reason, explanation... and it's 'concise'!

For some church history I chose "Church History 101" (Ferguson, Beeke, Haykin, \$9.99, Paperback). This book is small, is only 100 pages long and each of the 20 chapters briefly covers a century of history each. As an introduction, this is a great book to introduce young people to the church over the past 2000 years.

Calvin writes this in "A Little Book on the Christian Life" (\$9.99, Paperback) regarding the short work this book is: "... even if a longer work on the subject of the Christian life were worthwhile, I would hesitate to attempt such now, because my purpose in this work is to present doctrine simply and concisely". This is a small book packed with truth and brimming with passion. Something more modern, Jaquelle Crowe's book "This Changes Everything" (\$19.99, Hardcover) is direct in its call for teenagers to own their faith and transform their identity to submit to God in all parts of their lives. She wrote it when she was eighteen, and

John Piper's "Don't Waste Your Life" (\$16.99, Paperback) is one of those "new classic" books that needs to be read. As you read the book you can hear Piper's Minnesotan accent through each page as he gives emphasis of living for God's glory and not mediocre pursuits of comfort and fleeting passion.

For guys, "Disciplines of a Godly Young Man" by R. Kent Hughes and W. Carey Hughes (\$19.99, Hardcover) is a call to be 'real' and own their Christian life in a godly manner. It's a call to maturity, and not the kind of immaturity we still see in tweens (those in their twenties that still have the maturity of a teenager).

"Face Time" by Kristen Hatton (\$21.99, Paperback) is a book for girls to talk through identity, covering issues like body image, sex, materialism and more in an age of selfies and social media. With space for reflection and journaling it's a practical book that calls girls to be identified with their Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

"Set an Example" by Tim Challies (\$9.99, Paperback) is a call to be an example to those older and younger and pursue godliness in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity.


