Some fun and easy activities to keep little explorers busy this Christmas holiday....

HOME MADE SNOW

Get your diggers and snow ploughs out in some home made snow made from conditioner and baking powder.

SALT DOUGH DECORATIONS

Mix 2 cups of flour with 1 cup of salt. Add up to 1 cup of water gradually. Use the least amount of water possible to avoid the dough getting too sticky. Roll the dough out to about 5mm thick, cut out shapes and make a hole for hanging. Bake at 100 °C for 3-4 hours, turning a couple of times and making sure the hanging hole doesn't close. Decorate afterwards with glitter glue or paints.

STATIC TINSEL BALLOONS

Blow up some balloons and cut up some tinsel. Rub the balloons on your hair to create static electricity and watch how the tinsel is attracted to the balloons.

JINGLE BELL BALL RUN

Make your own jingle bell ball run using carboard boxes, kitchen roll tubes, sticky tape and a jingle bell.
