I wanted to bring you another great Easter project you can do at home, using foam egg shapes. I don't know about you but we always end up with holiday foam shapes, every single holiday. They are always fun and easy to create with, however, sometimes they just are missing that wow factor.

Looking for different ways to step up our Easter crafts and decorations, we decided to glitter them and WOW they look amazing. The best part is that they can be used as a wall decoration, you can hang them from the ceiling for some extra fun excitement for the kids or you can add them to your centerpieces.

If you don't have any foam egg shapes laying around, that's okay! You can also use construction paper to cut out your egg shapes to decorate them.

As a bonus, we've included an Egg and Bunny cut out the pattern.

1. Foam Eggs

- a. Supplies needed: Glitter; Mod Podge; paintbrush, plate/bowl; foam eggs
- b. Instruction:
 - i. If you do not have any foam eggs, you can use any construction paper to cut out an egg or bunny shape (pattern included)
 - ii. Pour some Mod Podge into a separate plate/bowl
 - iii. Dip the brush into Mod Podge and apply to foam egg in the desired pattern
 1. If using construction paper - apply a thin layer of Mod Podge
 - iv. Sprinkle glitter onto Mod Podge
 - v. Allow Mod Podge to dry
 - vi. Continue to Mod Podge/craft paint and glitter egg to your overall desired look
 - vii. Optional: Once the glittered egg is dried you can add a layer of Mod Podge to glittered areas of the egg to "seal" in the glitter to help reduce glitter from sprinkling off
 - viii. Embellish the bunny with cotton ball tails, just add a spot of mod podge in desired tail placement and then firmly place cotton ball tail down
