
Welcome to the fifth edition of the **North East of Scotland Performing Arts** Newsletter.

## Aberdeen Music Festival June 13th - 17th 2022

What is the June Festival of Music and Drama all about?	Information about the Charity and its work can be found on the website: www.nespa.scot.
Where is the syllabus?	The syllabus is available on the website and has details of all classes. Pdfs of each section are available for download free of charge.
How do I enter?	Entries should be made online. Teachers may elect to send a cheque separately, or use the paper entry form.
What do I do about an accompaniment?	The charity provides an Official Accompanist for many performances. Exceptions are Open classes, Adult Performances and Repertoire classes.
How do I find out the time and place of my Class?	Applicants will receive a ballot slip by email with details of class times and venue.
What if I am unable to attend the class?	If the timetable permits, an alternative slot will be offered. However this is not always possible. Refunds are not normally offered.
What if I am late?	You may still perform, so long as the adjudication for your class has not begun.
Can anyone come and hear me perform - is the Festival open to the public?	Yes, all are welcome. A supportive audience makes the festival a special experience. Tickets will be available online or can be purchased at the door.



After the success of the <u>Covid</u> Creative classes introduced in 2021 this section has been renamed and offers classes in celebration of the return to live performance.

Entries may be in any combination of genres – music, speech, drama, video, photography, etc. Live performances or video/live combined presentations are welcome.

Classes are available for solo entries, and for groups of 4 and below and groups of 4 and more in three age bands: Primary, Secondary & Open

#### Themes are:

#### Pomp and Circumstance:

Any performance with a regal theme.

#### Contemporary Performance

A performance of any work created since the year 2000.

#### Sondheim

Any performance inspired by or written by Steven Sondheim.

#### **Sharing and Celebrating Cultural Diversity**

Any work, in any genre from any culture.

As well as providing an opportunity for performance these classes offer an alternative to examination diets provided by professional bodies.




