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III. JEPA BUSINESS MEETING

Item Presenter Action

A. Accept April 25, 2022, Meeting Minutes Chairperson Approve

M/S Renee Goddard, Wesley Pratt to accept the April 25, 2022 minutes. Unanimous approval.

B. FY 2022/23 Program Update Marin Transit Update

Marin Transit General Manager Nancy Whelan introduced new Operations Manager Kyle French.

Marin Transit Operations Analyst Chris Whitlock gave the 2022/23 program update. The purpose of the lottery is to provide an equitable method for passes and equal opportunity for route of choice.

Between May 2 and May 13, 2022, 285 families registered (316 students total) which is down slightly from last year. Route award distribution started on May 15th. Hidden Valley and Ross Valley Charter started on May 23rd.

Families requested the following afternoon routes the most on the lottery registration form:

- WH-9 Express to San Anselmo Hub: 86 students
- WH-10 Memorial Park: 84 students
- WH-15 Red Hill Ave via Butterfield: 75 students

Some changes were made for morning bus choice later in summer when parents found out student's start time.

Marin Transit will be discussing improvements to lottery in the future. It's a lengthy process.

2022/23 Route Adjustments

Afternoon route WH-11 PM was revamped to WH-12 PM Red Hill Ave via Butterfield to serve both Fairfax and Sleepy Hollow.

FY 2022/23 YTD Pass Sales

Notable increases at Hidden Valley and all White Hill zero period routes. Income qualified passes increased by 5 and all 4 early departing afternoon routes at White Hill are sold out. Pass Sales YTD: 598.

Goddard asked if buses could run at full capacity or still COVID restrictions. Whitlock provided that buses still leave seat behind driver open. And Hidden Valley buses can fit more students given their size.

Pratt asked if a waitlist for afternoon buses at White Hill still existed. Whitlock replied that due to the route adjustment, the wait list dropped from 60 to 22 students. There is no wait list for morning buses. Pratt expressed concern for the amount of activity after school and potential need for another bus that left at 3pm. Whitlock replied that scheduling is hard given Hidden Valley and all students at White Hill now get out at the same time. Pratt expressed concern about number of e-bikes and that more cars are inevitable during rainy season.

Supervisor Rice asked if those on waitlist were riding the later bus. Whitlock said that some students were and some weren't. Superintendent Trahan asked if White Hill and Hidden Valley were to have staggered end times, how much time between would there need to be. Whitlock replied that 2 years ago White Hill got out at 3:10 and Hidden Valley at 2:50 which gave more flexibility to routes. Marin Transit team offered to do further work on determining best estimate of what the bell time separation would need to be. Trahan offered to talk to principals once more information is had.

C. FY 2022/23 Budget Year-end Estimate

Projected surplus for 2022/23 is \$22,221. This is the last year for Michael's contract so Marin Transit will issue an RFP and renegotiate.

Ross Valley Yellow Bus Program Summary

- 5 vehicle program
- Contract oversight provided by Marin Transit with service operated by Michael's Transportation
- Serves White Hill Middle School, Hidden Valley Elementary, and Ross Valley Charter
 - 85% of yellow bus pass holders attend White Hill
- Morning service is spread out due to staggering school start times
 - 0 routes sold out with the highest number of students on route WH-1 AM
- Afternoon service requires that buses return to White Hill due to students dismissing at the same time
 - 4 sold out routes at White Hill Middle School: WH-9, WH-10, WH-12, WH-15

4 and 5 Vehicle Scenario Comparison

4 Vehicle Scenario

Assumptions:

- Income qualified passes remain at \$100
- Bell schedules between Hidden Valley and White Hill are staggered
- **Pro:** Pass price increase more sustainable
 - \$515 > \$585
- Pro: Can maximize vehicle efficiency by combining undersold routes
- Con: Results in longer wait time in the afternoon at White Hill for late-departing routes

5 Vehicle Scenario

Assumptions:

- Income qualified passes remain at \$100
- Local contributions increase by approx. \$20,000
- Pro: Maintains current route structure and service level
- **Con:** Significant pass price increase
 - \$515 > \$915
