C. 2019/20 Program Pass Sales and Budget Review

Marin Transit

Discussion

The JEPA thanked Marin Transit for their work. Kelly Zalewski, Marin Transit, made a presentation on pass sales. Zalewski stated that the full priced passes are in align with enrollment numbers and that the reduced priced pass sales have decreased. Zalewski also pointed out that the budget shows approximately an \$11,000 deficit.

A resident asked if the price for the for the zero-period bus could come down since it seems to be empty. Zalewski stated she did not want to incentivize the one-way pass. Instead Marin Transit wanted encourage people to buy annual passes.

Superintendent Rick Bagley stated this coming year White Hill will see a drop in enrollment, about 70 kids less.

D. 2020/21 Program Service Levels, Draft Budget & Pass Pricing

Marin Transit

Discussion

Zalewski made a presentation on service levels. One issue that had come up was the pick-up and drop off at the Log Cabin location near Memorial Park in San Anselmo. More specifically drivers were concerned with safety for the end of day drop off. Marin Transit was discussing the use of a bus stop on Sir Francis Drake Boulevard at Sunny Hills instead. This would increase the walk for some kids however.

Katie Rice stated that historically, all the bus routes used to be on Sir Francis Drake Boulevard. David Donery stated that there was worry about the younger kids from Hidden Valley. Chris Whitlock added that the Kindergarten through 5th grade buses run at 2:45 pm.

Nancy Vernon asked if there could be two different spots where they are picked up and dropped off. Zalewski was concerned about consistent messaging. Zalewski added the concern was having kids dropped off at Sir Francis Drake Boulevard. Nancy Whelan asked if there could be 2-4 PM restrict parking at Memorial Park. David Donery stated he would look into it. Rick Bagley stated they could hand it over to the Safe Routes To School group to see if the idea of dropping kids off on Sir Francis Drake Boulevard or in Memorial Park is okay.

Zalewski spoke of an idea of an additional stop for the Hub Express bus at the Yolanda Station stop neighborhood. Brian Colbert stated it seemed like this is a lot of change and had concerns about safety. There was a majority consensus to do a pilot of the stop.

Steve Lamb, resident, asked for clarification of the numbers and colors were on the slides. Zalewski stated the numbers where numbers of passengers and the colors indicated higher numbers and lower numbers.

Budget discussions began.

Three scenarios were presented to the group. In Scenario 1, there would be no change this year. In Scenario 2, there would be a \$10 pass price increase. In Scenario 3, there would be a pass increase and it assumes free and reduced pass sales are free to students.

Garrett Toy asked about the budget deficit. Nancy Whelan, Marin Transit, stated they haven't explored how to deal with. Whelan stated they may need to pass it on to next year. However, if it were to carryover, it would be higher pass sales.

Katie Rice stated the group needed to get the data point for who is unincorporated Marin.

Rick Bagley asked at what point would they decide to drop a bus from a route. Zalewski stated they need all six busses in the afternoon because of demand. In addition, the contract is for each bus for the day, so dropping the bus in the morning might not help.

There was consensus to come back with information regarding the budget deficit option, to look at if there was negotiation with a half day bus in the contract, and to look at parking prices. The group also wanted to know how much space is needed for 6 busses.

E. 2020/21 Pass Sales Approach (Lottery)

Marin Transit

Discussion

Zalewski made a presentation about the pass sales lottery.

Katie Rice leaves meeting at 2:42 PM

There was group consensus to hold the pass sales after spring break. Rick Bagley mentioned the school has software that translates to all home languages, so the school could help with messaging. Bagley was also open to setting up computers at school for the people who need that. Rick Bagley also spoke of gaming the system and mentioned Student ID numbers could be used as a more anonymous way for the lottery. Bagley also offered to reach out to the families that need reduced pricing.

F. Pass Sales Features (variable pricing/youth passes +)

Marin Transit

Discussion

Zalewski presented other pass options, such as offering variable single pass prices. The group felt it was generally worth piloting.

G. Supplemental funding source for income qualified family pass

JEPA Board member

Approve

Nancy Vernon asked if they could offer free passes and not allow the students to use them on the busiest route. Zalewski stated it would be challenging to do that.

Nancy Vernon stated that only 15% of free and reduced lunch students had bought their passes. Vernon stated she was part of a community campaign to raise money and they were looking into various grant programs, so they could nail down a program.

H. Comparison of other existing Yellow Bus Programs in Marin

Marin Transit

Discussion

Zalewski and Whelan presented. Whelan mentioned Mill Valley has local schools in neighborhoods and the kids can bike and walk to school. In San Anselmo, there is only one way to get to school.

Renee Goddard asked how to get ridership to increase for the afternoon bus. Nancy Vernon stated the principal wanted to hear from parents in order to have the school to stay open.


Status



- As of March 16, all Marin County school campuses are closed and students are engaged in remote learning
- Marin Transit notified Michael's Transportation that daily routes would be cancelled until school campuses re-opened
- Per the contract, Marin Transit does not pay Michael's Transportation when service is not operated.
- Michael's Transportation has furloughed all of their drivers.
- Marin Transit emailed all parents on Friday, March 13 notifying them that monthly bus pass payments were suspended.

Bus Pass Refund Policy Timing



As of Friday, April 3, a date for school campuses to re-open is unconfirmed.

Once a final re-opening date for school campuses is known, then Marin Transit will move forward with this process to notify parents and begin issuing refunds.

Bus Pass Refund Draft Policy Goals



- Refund for service not provided
- Keep it simple
- Offer parents an opportunity to support the program and drivers via donation option
- Issue refunds as quickly as possible

Bus Pass Refund Calculation



"In Full" One-way Bus Pass Refund Calculation

- Per Day \$ of an Annual Pass: \$485/180 = \$2.70
- Days remaining in school year as of March 16: 57
- Per Day Rate x Remaining School Days: \$154.00

Monthly One-way Bus Pass Cancellation/Refund Calculation

- Remaining monthly payments: 2
- Monthly payment: \$52.50
- Total amount not billed: \$105.00
- Amount to refund from March payment: \$49.00

Refund calculations assume campus closure extends through June

Bus Pass Refund Draft Process



Amount available for refund or donation:

- "In Full" One-way Payments: \$154.00
- "Monthly" One-way Payments: \$49.00
- 1. Parents will be notified via email of the refund amount
- 2. Parents will be given the opportunity to donate their refund (see eligible amounts above)
- Donations are "opt-in" and parents will have one week to complete a google form to notify Marin Transit of their donation.
- 4. After the one week period, then all refunds will be processed.
- 5. Once processed, it will take 3 5 business days for the refund to be completed.

Donation Purpose & Scenarios



Why offer donation option?

- To fund a driver incentive for furloughed Michael's Transportation drivers.
- To support long term financial stability of the program with a reserve fund
- Reduces the number of refund transactions to be processed

Agenda Item III.D: Update on Supplemental funding source for income qualified family passes

BECOME A YELLOW BUS CHAMPION and Close the Gap for Families in Need!

Did you know that it is becoming increasingly harder for families in need to send their children to school through the traditional means of transportation in the Ross Valley?

Marin Transit's Yellow Bus program provides students the opportunity to ride to and from school on a bus that's been specifically designed for student transportation operated by drivers trained to service this population.

However, despite multiple funding sources, for students that qualify for free and reduced, the one-way pass is \$242 or \$485 for round trip. We are hoping to raise \$34,500 through a community-wide campaign targeted to businesses concerned about traffic congestion and equity for all our youth.

How is the Program Funded?

The program has been subsidized by several key stakeholders including the County of Marin, Town of San Anselmo, Town of Fairfax and Measure AA funds distributed by Marin Transit. Without these contributions, the cost of a bus pass would nearly double. The remaining costs of the program are funded through pass sales and other fees. Program partners include the Town of San Anselmo, the Town of Fairfax, the Ross Valley School District, and the County of Marin. These partners provide policy guidance and advice to Marin Transit.

Can Free and Reduced Families Afford a Bus Pass at Current Reduced Cost?

NO! Over the past four years, at White Hill Middle School (the biggest user of the yellow bus program), participation from the students who are eligible for free or reduced one-way passes plummeted from 85% to just 15% (only 13 students out of 87 in school year 2019/2020). Among the 3 participating schools, only 16 of the 133 eligible students have purchased a free and reduced pass.

How Can We Close This Gap?

By raising approximately \$65,000 a year, the yellow bus program can offer free (or close to free) passes to economically disadvantaged families in our district, thus providing equal opportunities for all students AND getting more cars off the road. Schools are in process of applying for grants to cover half that cost, but concerned stakeholders are hoping to raise the additional \$34,500 through a community-wide campaign targeted to businesses concerned about traffic congestion and equity for all our youth.
