Nominating a tile colour variation for individual colours and ranges is becoming popular with manufacturers, allowing both us and our customers to get a better understanding of the variation they will receive in each box.

This is a guide only and is rated on a 4-point scale.

\section*{Vo}

Monochromatic - The tiles are very uniform, monochromatic colour with little or no variation. 

\section*{V1}

Uniform Appearance (Minimal Variation) - Differences among pieces from the same production run are minimal. The tiles should have uniform appearance and minimal variation. 

V2 Slight to Moderate Variation - Clearly distinguishable texture and/or pattern within similar colours. The tiles have a slight to moderate variation in shade, design and texture. 

\section*{V3}

Moderate to Considerable Variation - While the colours present on a single piece of tile will be indicative of the colours to be expected on other tiles, the design and/or amount of colour on each piece may vary significantly. These tiles have moderate to considerable variation in colour, design, texture and overall appearance. 

\section*{V4}

Substantial Variation - Random colour differences from tile to tile, so that one tile may have totally different colours from other tiles. Thus, the final installation will be unique. The tiles will have a substantial random variation in colour, design, texture and overall appearance.
