

Ultimate Care Guide for Fiddle Leaf Fig

Caring for a fiddle leaf fig plant can transform any interior space into a vibrant, lively area. It's not just about adding a touch of green; it's about fostering growth and vitality, both in the plant and in your living or working environment.



Firstly, understanding the basic needs of your fiddle leaf fig is crucial. These plants crave bright, filtered light. Place them near a window where they can bask in the sunshine without being scorched by the direct rays. It's a balance that might take a little adjusting to find the perfect spot.

Next, maintaining a consistent watering schedule is key. The goal is to keep the soil moist but not waterlogged. A good rule of thumb is to allow the top inch of soil to dry out before watering again. Over-watering is a common misstep that can lead to root rot, so erring on the side of caution is advisable.



The Checklist

Location & Light: Ensure the plant is positioned in a spot with bright, indirect light. Rotate your plant every few months to ensure even growth on all sides.

Watering Routine: Water your fiddle leaf fig when the top inch of soil is dry, typically once a week, but adjust based on humidity levels and season. Use room temperature water to avoid shocking the plant.

Humidity & Temperature: These plants thrive in humidity. Consider placing a diffuser nearby or misting the leaves regularly. Keep the temperature around 18-24°C for optimal growth.

Soil & Fertilization: Use a well-draining soil mix and fertilize every few months during the growing season with a balanced, water-soluble fertilizer. Reduce feeding in the winter months.

Pruning & Cleaning: Prune any dead or overgrown leaves to encourage new growth. Wipe down leaves with a damp cloth to remove dust and promote photosynthesis.

Pest Management: Keep an eye out for signs of pests and treat any infestations promptly with natural or recommended solutions.

Visual Guide



Brown Crispy leaves

- Check the plant isn't getting direct sunlight
- Check the soil, it should be just damp on top, if not give it a water and good misting of the leaves
- Place a diffuser near by to release moisture into the air



Reddish Dots under leaves

- Due to irregular watering
- Routinely water your plant every 10-14 days with roughly the same amount of water
- In between watering give leafs a mist with luke warm water



Mealy Bugs

- Remove by hand with a soft micro fibre cloth
- If they are particularly sticky use a soft alcohol wipe to gently remove
- Every few weeks gently wipe leaves with avocado oil to keep shiny, clean and help prevent pests



Dropping leaves

- This is a sign of distress
- Go back through the check list
- Check soil, it may be to wet (overwatering) or to dry (underwatering)
